While bowlers presented Abahani their fifth win from seven games, the batters still ominously appeared vulnerable after their three-wicket defeat against Surjo Tarun in the previous match where the last year's runners-up scored 193 runs

Opener Nafis lobal with 38 was the top-scorer for Abahani followed by 29 extras. And had Alamair and Ali Arman not produced 33 runs for the last wicket, the match could have gone the other way. Pakistani Ziaur Rahman scored

37 for Kalabagan before being undone by a delivery from compatriot Hossain that never popped up after pitching. While Abahani struggled in their

first match at the Bangabandhu National Stadium, Bangladesh Biman kept up their impressive run of form to join Abahani and Victoria in the second position behind holders Mohammedan




