

Scientist sees 'small Bangladesh' in Bay of Bengal

A London-based Bangladeshi scientist has developed a technology that promises to float a "small Bangladesh" in the Bay of Bengal in five years using the natural hydrodynamic forces.

"A landmass almost one third of the size of Bangladesh can emerge with the use of a mechanism applying the natural hydrodynamic forces or flow of gushing waters," Dr Abdul Khaleque, a natural scientist, told BSS on Friday while explaining his recent innovation.

He added: "The mechanism will expedite an already existing slow natural process of land accretion in shallow sea front areas near estuaries."

The scientist says with the use of the technology, Bangladesh could get some 40,000 square kilometre landmass in the bay adjoining the coastlines and it would help remove all water-related problems including flood, erosion and drought deepening the river beds and washing away the silts.

In addition, this would keep the rivers navigable, increase wa-

ter flow in rivers and availability of surface water, reduce dependence on groundwater for irrigation and other uses, recharge the dwindling groundwater level and heighten the river shores, he said.

The World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO) of Geneva had patented the technology in 1998 endorsing the innovation of Dr Khaleque, basically a biochemist and faculty member of Royal Holloway College of London University.

Dr Khaleque said his mechanism would create "convergent current" in rivers to vibrate riverbeds during the monsoon and thus deepen the river depth while the onrush of waters would deposit the silts to certain points of the bay under an engineering design.

According to Bangladesh Water Development Board and other estimates, three major rivers - the Ganges, Brahmaputra and Meghna - alone carry some 13 billion tonnes of silts to Bangladesh daily from the upstream regions beyond the country's border.

The huge silts are gradually

heightening the riverbeds causing massive siltation and consequent floods and navigation problems, reducing the carrying capacities of rivers.

Water Development Board officials said the situation has been aggravated as the neighbouring India reportedly developed structures to trap silts, to withdraw waters in lean season. But in monsoon, it release the silts, causing massive siltation in Bangladesh side, they said.

Dr Khaleque, who calls his mechanism as "natural dredging" said, it could remove the country's growing concerns for navigability of rivers.

Experts say the use of dredgers to keep the rivers navigable is almost an impossible idea for riverine Bangladesh, crisscrossed by 230 major rivers, because of high cost. According to an official estimate, dredging of per cubic feet silt requires Tk 11.

"Rivers were created by the natural hydrodynamic force of the nature, not by dredging, and it can only be maintained by the hydrodynamic force and not by dredging," the scientist said.
