

## Consultant to assess traffic load of Dhaka City: Huda

UNB, Dhaka

The government is planning to appoint a consultant to assess traffic load of capital Dhaka in a bid to free the city dwellers from growing traffic congestion.

The consultant will find out pros and cons of Dhaka's traffic load capacity and thereby recommend how many cars, buses, rickshaws and other vehicles can be allowed to ply in the capital.

Communications Minister Barister Nazmul Huda disclosed it while he was addressing the launching and contract signing ceremony of 2,000 pollution-free 800-cc taxicab of Cab Express Bangladesh Limited at a city hotel on Sunday night.

He said the mega-city is apparently a small one with regards to load capacity.

Some new 800-cc black taxicabs launched by Cab-Ex already started plying the city streets and 2,000 such cars will go into operation in phases within next two

years.

State Minister for Home Affairs Lutfozzaman Babar, Cab-Ex Chairman GM Siraj MP, DCCI President Matiuur Rahman Minto, Cab Association of Bangladesh general secretary Anwarul Islam Tarek, Managing Director of Prime Finance & Investment T K Poddar and Cab-Ex managing director Khandaker M Azad also spoke on the occasion.

Disclosing another visionary plan of magnetic levitation electrical transport system, the Communications Minister said that within next 3-4 years, people of Dhaka would be able to travel to Chittagong only by one hour.

"Sounds impossible? But I'm disclosing this immature plan that will be matured and you will be able to travel carrying your car in the train and return to Dhaka completing all your jobs," Huda said.

The Minister said by September 1, two-stroke auto-rickshaws

would be wiped out of the streets. He urged the cab businessmen to provide one taxicab against two two-stroke auto-rickshaws through exchange programme.

"And the government will consider so that two-stroke auto-rickshaws will be allowed to ply outside Dhaka, where pollution is till less," he said.

State Minister Lutfozzaman Babar said the government has taken some important steps to provide security to the taxicab drivers and passengers.

Mentioning the need for a modern city transport system, CAB general secretary Anwarul Islam Tarek said at present, some 2,500 taxicabs are plying on the street, but the number should be 10,000 to meet the demand of the city-dwellers.

DCCI president Matiuur Rahman said that if the government allowed plying of taxicabs outside Dhaka, huge employment would be generated.

## 'Set up more poultry farms to create jobs'

LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan yesterday laid emphasis on setting up more poultry farms in the country to create job opportunity and achieve economic progress.

"The poultry sector can play an important role for alleviating poverty which is the main obstacle to overall development of the country," he said while inaugurating the 'Distributors Council, 2002' of Kazi Farms Limited, one of the country's leading poultry farms, at a city hotel.

The minister called upon the authorities and the private entrepreneurs to take appropriate measures to help grow local market of the poultry products and increase purchasing capacity of the people.

He said the government of Prime Minister Khaleda Zia has identified the poultry as a thrust sector and given priority to it along with the agri-sector.

"We have given priority to these sectors because of their potentials for creating job opportunities at home and making a place for agricultural and poultry products in the markets abroad," he said.

The minister assured the entrepreneurs of government's support and stressed the need for maintaining quality of the poultry products for increasing export.

Presided over by managing director of Kazi Farms Limited Jahedul Hasan, the inaugural function was also addressed by director of the Farms Kazi Jaheen Hasan, Laboratory Manager Pawana Suttapak, General Manager (Production) Dr Suwat and Deputy General Manager (Technical) Dr Iqbal.

A total of 250 distributors of the Farms across the country took part in the function.

## Belarus to open embassy in Dhaka soon

Belarus will soon open its embassy in Dhaka for strengthening bilateral relations, particularly for enhancing trade and investment.

Belarusian Ambassador to Dhaka based in New Delhi Vladimir A Sakalowski disclosed the plan during a meeting with Commerce Minister Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury in the city yesterday.

The envoy of the breakaway Soviet Republic apprised the minister of his country's interest in importing jute and jute-goods, readymade garments and some other items from Bangladesh.

Laying emphasis on exchange of visits by trade delegations of the two countries, he said: "Existing

trade volume between the two countries is less than the potential."

As the Ambassador appreciated the investment policy of Bangladesh, the Commerce Minister requested through him his country's entrepreneurs to invest here.

For facilitating expansion of trade and business, the minister emphasised signing trade agreement between the two countries.

Welcoming the Belarusian ambassador, he said Bangladesh is keen to augment its trade volume in the entire CIS region, including Belarus, which is considered a potential market for Bangladeshi exports.

## 12 arms seized

Police recovered 12 firearms and 15 bullets during countrywide combing operation in the last 24 hours ending at 6:00 am yesterday.

Police during the drive also arrested 1,311 people including eight alleged identified criminals from across the country. Six people were held in connection with the arms recovery and six separate cases were filed under Arms Act against them, a police headquarter press release said.

## Hate violence, corruption

President tells students at first convocation of AUST

President A Q M Badruddoza Chowdhury yesterday urged the educated youths to hate violence and corruption and said they should get prepared to come in aid of the family and the nation.

The students "must learn to hate violence and corruption and work with a vision to help themselves, their families and the country," the President told the first convocation of the Ahsanullah University of Science and Technology (AUST) at Osmani Memorial Hall in the city.

AUST, the first institute of higher learning in science and technology in private sector, was founded by Dhaka Ahsania Mission in 1995. Over 600 students graduated from the university. Presently, it has an enrolment of nearly 1,200 students in eight disciplines.

Education Minister Dr M Osman Faruk, Vice-Chancellor of AUST Prof M H Khan, Executive Director of Ahsania Mission Kazi Rafiqul Alam, Chairman of the Syndicate Kazi Fazlur Rahman and president of Diabetic Society (Association) Prof Wahiduddin Ahmed also spoke on the occasion.

The President told the graduates to convert themselves into assets of the family, society and the country. And the responsibility of the university authority is to see that the students "are groomed up with latest knowledge, strong character and uncompromising patriotism," he added.

President Chowdhury lauded the role of educationists and resource persons in combining their efforts to spread higher education through establishment of private universities.

He mentioned that "there is a distinctly visible trend now among entrepreneurs to go for establishing universities in the private sector," but some of them (the entrepreneurs) have rather commercial propensities.

Referring to lack of own campuses by a number of private universities, the President said a campus of its own is of "absolute necessity and pride for students, teachers and guardians." He expressed the hope that AUST would be able to move to its own campus before the next convocation.

Education Minister Dr Osman Faruk appreciated the sponsors of AUST for establishing need-based institution for learning and said in the present day, the higher education is very much different from that of the past.

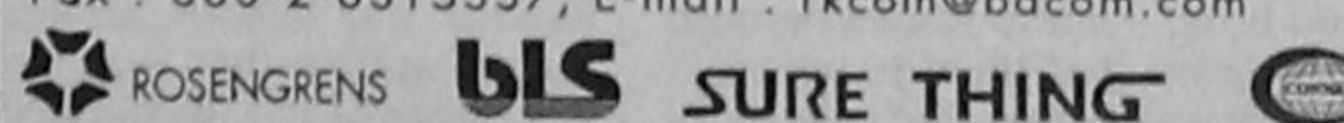
