Khoka, Badshah, Tayeb lead in mayoral race

Polling peaceful, low turnout in Dhaka

Sadek Hossain Khoka and Tayebur Rahman were poised for a clean sweep in Dhaka and Khulna respectively while incumbent Rajshahi Mayor Mizanur Rahman Minu faced strong challenge from 11-party candidate Fazle Hossain Badshah in the long overdue elections to three major city corporations in the country.

Khoka bagged some 29,539 votes in 85 out of 1,342 centres in Dhaka. His closest rival ATM Hemayetuddin got 1,678 votes. In Rajshahi, Badshah led the race with 37,104 votes in 61 out of 130

centres, with Minu trailing close, bagging 35,430 votes. In Khulna, results of 54 out of 241 centres were available. Tayeb led by

35,915 votes while Enayet Ali pocketed 19,721 votes as his nearest rival. Meantime, elections were held by and large peacefully. Voter turnout in

Dhaka was remarkably poor, showing a lack of confidence in candidates. But in the other two cities, enthusiasm among the electorates was quite high In the capital, absence of enthusiasm among the electorate was induced by apprehension of widespread violence, presence of people with criminal background in the race and boycott by the main opposition Awami League. However, contrary to common fear, polling passed off without any major incidents of violence, as a 33,000-strong security blanket kept a tight rein on potential trouble-mongers.

In Dhaka, polling officers and agents, supporters of the ward commissioner hopefuls heavily outnumbered the voters at most of the 1,342 centres, fortified by law enforcing personnel.

Arrival of ballot boxes at the Election Commission was slow and boxes were still trickling in from different wards of the capital till 10:45pm, sparking speculations on the delay.

Our Khulna correspondent said that turnout in the city centres was gener ally high, due to strong rivalry. According to unofficial estimate by local EC officials, voter turnout was about 60 per cent

PDB for costly expansion of Haripur power plant

No mention of SAPI suggestion, ERD objection in purchase committee briefing

Ignoring views of an independent consultant and that of the Economic Relation Division (ERD), the Power Development Board (PDB) will seek the Cabinet Purchase Committee approval for expansion of the decade-old Haripur power plant.

In 2000, a consultant, appointed by the Japanese government under the special assistance in project implementation (SAPI) programme, concluded that a new power scheme would be much more cost effective than the expansion project. The ERD also supported the

But, in its briefing, which will be placed before the cabinet committee next week, the PDB has made no mention of such observations and sought approval to pended due to disagreement between the PDB, the ERD and the Japanese financiers of the project.

The project, conceived in 1991 outlining a cost of 151 billion yen (nearly US\$66 million) or Tk 416 crore, aims at expanding the 100MW Haripur plant's generation capacity by 109MW.

However, with such a budget, it is possible to set up a new 180MW plant. The 360MW AES Haripur private power plant, which was commissioned last year, has been set up at a cost of US\$126 million.

The PDB briefing does refer to an ERD suggestion for conversion to combined-cycle plant but rejects it in favour of expansion.

There is no mention either of the observation made by the PDB tender committee on evaluation of the three
