Leg-spinner Danish Kaneria snapped up five wickets to seal Pakistan's biggest win in Test history by an innings and 324 runs against New Zealand in the first Test here Friday.

Kaneria took 5-110 at the Gaddafi Stadium as the tourists were dismissed for 246 in the last over before stumps on the third day, marking their worst ever Test defeat.

New Zealand captain Stephen Fleming topscored with a pugnacious 66 and Lou Vincent made 57. but none of the Kiwi batsmen were able to put up any real resistance to the Pakistani onslaught.

A ninth wicket stand of 18 between Daryl Tuffey and Brooke Walker delayed the inevitable until Kaneria took Tuffey for 12 and Saqlain Mushtaq dismissed Chris Martin for nought to secure the

"It was a tough day in the office, especially when you go and chase the ball for two days, but we are hurt after disappointing batting," Fleming

"The conditions were not unplayable and we need to be much better in the next Test.'

LAST SPOT FOR ROMARIO?

Brazil's 1994 World Cup winning hero Romario's dreams of making it to this year's finals were kept alive Thursday when national coach Luiz Scolari revealed he had just one vacancy left in his final squad.

Scolari has tried to avoid giving in to enormous pressure at including e 36-vear-old former Barcelona star but according to a correspondent from the normally well-informed newspaper 'O Globo' Romario's name will be on the final squad list when it is named next Monday.

"Of the 23 players who will be going to the finals there just remains one doubt," Scolari said.

Romario, who has had a successful season with Vasco da Gama, had launched an emotional appeal in April to be included in the squad but Scolari was reluctant to select him as he regards him as being a disruptive influence in the dressing room.

Baggio's message for Trap

Baggio has undergone a series of medical tests which have proven that at 35 years he is in top physical condition after making a nearmiraculous recovery from a serious

knee injury suffered in January. And he sent a message to Trapattoni Friday: "I'm in better shape than in 1994 and I've worked hard to achieve this."

Trapattoni has refused to rule out Baggio from the Italian squad for the finals in Japan and South Korea. starting May 31.

"You can never say never. I will be keeping an eye on Baggio," said Trapattoni last week.

The Italy coach had earlier this month appeared to shoot down the veteran star's hopes of a fourth World Cup when he named his complement of attackers for the

Baggio, once the world's most expensive player when he joined Juventus from Fiorentina, has had a alittering career but is best remembered for his penalty miss in the 1994 World Cup Final penalty shoot-out that handed victory to

Italy play Ecuador, Mexico and Croatia in the first phase Group G of the World Cup finals.

World Cup sans champions?



The French football team on Friday united in denouncing undemocratic attitudes in their country as star midfielder Robert Pires warned that the reigning champions would boycott the World Cup this month if far-right leader Jean-Marie Le Pen becomes president.

A statement issued by French captain Marcel Desailly on behalf of the world and European champions hit out at "attitudes which are dangerous for democracy and freedom.' It did not refer specifically to the

second round runoff of the French presidential election on Sunday between Le Pen and current presi dent Jacques Chirac, and was not signed individually by the players. It read: "Players from the French

team, different in their origins, their perceptions and personal commitments, are unanimous today in comdemning the resurgent notions of exclusion and racism.

"They perceive as intolerable and indefensible attitudes which are dangerous to democracy and freedom, particularly in a multiethnic and multi-cultural France

Ghanaian-born Desailly, who plays for Chelsea in England, said the fact the squad came from different cultural backgrounds was

Pires, a player at English Premiership giants Arsenal, also waded into the fray, suggesting that many French players would find it

impossible to play for their country in the World Cup if Le Pen wins this weekend's election.

Pires has already been ruled out of making the trip to Japan and South Korea because of a knee

But he warned: "Of course we

extreme-right were to win the election I think more than several players would refuse to take part in the World Cup.p

"We are French but the team's roots are from everywhere, so it would make it an impossibility to play for your country if France is governed by the far-right.

"As players we have the responsibility to show people that they must react to this threat quickly. I urge everyone to vote for Jacques Chirac."

Le Pen, who stunned the French political establishment by beating Prime Minister Lionel Jospin in the first round of voting last Sunday to oust him from the race, has never been a friend of the

current French side. His most infamous attack on them came in 1996 when he said several of the players were not even French and some could not or would not sing the national

anthem, the Marseillaise.

Zinedine Zidane, the world's most expensive footballer whose father is Algerian, has also urged people to vote against National Front (FN) leader Le Pen. His call was echoed by his international team-mates Bixente Lizarazu, Willy Sagnol, Youri Djorkaeff and Claude Makelele.
