# Pakistan turn to ICC

The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) sought the support of the International Cricket Council (ICC) and its member countries on Thursday to ensure that Pakistan is not isolated as an international

"I have spoken to the ICC chief executive Malcolm Speed, and our viewpoint was that the (ICC) member boards should hold on before giving any policy statements to allow the situation to settle down," PCB director Brigadier Munawar Rana told Reuters.

New Zealand cut short their tour of Pakistan on Wednesday after a bomb blast outside their Karachi hotel shortly before the start of the second and final Test.

The bomb exploded alongside a navy bus parked near two major city hotels, killing 14 people including 11 French defence technicians.

"We ourselves are upset by this incident." said Rana. "We can now only regroup and hope for the best. But we need the support of the ICC and member nations in this regard.
