It will take around a month to six weeks for the injury to be treated, according to club doctors.



Dravid put on 155 for the second wicket with opener Wasim Jaffer (86) and 58 for the unbroken fourth wicket with skipper Souray Ganguly as India reached 226-3 at stumps on the opening day after being put in to bat.

Left-arm fast bowler Pedro Collins removed Jaffer and Tendulkar off successive deliveries before Dravid and Ganguly (41 not out) sustained their team's hopes of
