"Club lovalties have been put aside and now it's all go for the French team," Desailly said at France's training base south of

"I can't wait to get back into competition. Everything that goes before has to be done but sometimes it becomes wearing.

"We've been at Clairefontaine for four days already and it seems a long time.
"We've been shut up here for a

France's participation in the Confederations Cup in Asia last year had given them a head start over other nations. "There will be things to get adapted to, such as the time differ-
