#### Dillon bucked up by Lara

West Indies pace spearhead Mervyn Dillon said that a few words from team mate Brian Lara helped him to pick up his first five-wicket haul in a test match for more than four years.

The Trinidadian finished with career-best figures of five for 71 as India were bowled out for 212 in their first innings on the third day of the deciding fifth test. West Indies reached the close on 165 for seven, a lead of 375 runs.

"Brian Lara had a chat with the guvs vesterday and he said a few things that really helped me take a step in the right direction," Dillon

"It will help all of the guys over the next two days of this crucial Test."

Monday's effort was Dillon's second five-wicket haul in a Test, his previous best was a burst of five for 111 against Pakistan in Karachi in December 1997.

"Thankfully this one is out of the way." he said. "I've got guite a few four-wicket hauls, I was looking to get five here and things worked out for me.'

The 27-year-old has picked up a personal best 22 wickets in the series, and said he was responding to the pressure of being West Indies' main strike bowler after the retirements of Courtney Walsh and Curtly Ambrose last year.

"I've been working very hard," said Dillon. "There is a lot of pressure on me being the senior fast bowler in the team. I have been bowling a lot more consistently."

Dillon, playing in his 26th Test, took his wicket tally to 98 and is now getting close to his three-figure

"The 100-mark is in the pipeline. That's going to happen, I just hope it's sooner rather than later. But my concern right now is to try to get India out again.'

That left Sri Lanka needing a highly improbable 250 for victory with just over an hour of the final session remaining after they had piled up 555 for eight declared in their first innings.

## Hingis' 'successful' surgery



Martina Hingis had surgery Monday to repair ankle ligaments, but her doctor said it is too early to assess her tennis future.

Dr. Heinz Buehlmann told Swiss radio he was pleased with the result of the 90-minute operation, during which he repaired one torn and three loose ligaments in Hingis' left

He said he expected Hingis to make a swift recovery, but that she would need "6-to-8 weeks of rest to help the healing process."

Hingis also was suffering from severe pain in her feet, left knee and left hip, which forced her to stop playing or practising

Buehlmann said Monday that he wanted to wait until the postoperation swelling had gone down before making a final assessment of Hingis' chances of an early return to tennis. He said her career still could be threatened if the pain in her feet and joints returned.

Last week, Buehlmann said he feared the ligament damage -which he said was "complex" -could end the 21-year-old Hingis'

On Saturday, after two days of Zurich, Buehlmann said the outlook was positive, with Hingis likely to resume light water training and cycling in about three weeks -- and be back on the tennis court in three

Buehlmann also operated or Hingis' right foot in October last vear, after which the Swiss star was out of action for two months. The ankle injury already has

forced Hingis to miss the German Open and last week's Italian Open. On Friday, the WTA said the

player also would miss the French Open, which begins May 27.

The French Öpen will be the first Grand Slam tournament Hingis has missed since turning professional in 1994, breaking a streak of 29 straight appearances.

## PCB remains upbeat

New Zealand cricket authorities have remained non-committal about playing in a tri-series one-day tournament in Pakistan planned for August this year, a Pakistani official said Tuesday.

New Zealand cut short a tour of Pakistan earlier this month when a terror bomb blast near their hotel killed 14 people, including 11 French

Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) director Munawwar Rana told the news agency that New Zealand Cricket (NZC) had written to express appreciation of the arrangements on the tour before it had to be aborted.

"NZC has appreciated the

arrangements on the tour through a letter and if the affected board is so supportive we feel its a welcome sign," Rana said.

'The board, management and all the players are unanimous that the PCB provided the best security and it would not be reasonable to hold PCB responsible for the mishap," he quoted the letter as saying.

"Whether they tour Pakistan is a subsidiary issue and we have not discussed the matter with the NZC but would take it up once the dust settles down." Rana said.

Australia are also scheduled to take part in the one-day tournament in August and September ahead of three Tests against Pakistan in October, but several top Australian players have expressed fears for

Australia's Test captain Steve Waugh, however, has said he would

tour if the Australian Cricket Board gave the go-ahead.

"Steve Waugh's statement is also very positive and we would want the cricket world to allow us some time and let us fulfil our commitment to host positive cricket." Rana said.

Pakistan cricket has been badly hit in the wake of the September 11 attacks on the United States and Washington's reprisals against neighbouring Afghanistan.

New Zealand's aborted tour was originally scheduled for September-October last year before being postponed, while Sri Lanka refused to tour Pakistan for a makeshift oneday series two months later.

Pakistan had to play its home series against the West Indies on neutral grounds in Sharjah earlier this year because of West Indian concerns over security.
