Accordingly, a nine-member upazila food committee has already been formed with the local MP and TNO as its chief advisor and president respectively to start purchase of paddy, Antarjami said.

occurs in 25 per cent or more of infants born to women who have been infected with rubella during the first three months of pregnancy. Defects are rare if the infection occurs after the 20th week of preg-

The disease is caused by the airborne virus and is spread by close contact. A mother with an active infection can also transmit it to a foetus. The disease is usually mild and may even go unnoticed. Children may have a few symptoms. but adults may experience a warning symptom

Rubella is almost 100 per cent preventable with vaccination. Live rubella virus vaccine is recommended for all children. It is routinely given between 12 and 15 months of age but is sometimes given earlier during epidemics.

The extended programme of mmunisation does not include rubella vaccination for children. Many experts believe that rubella vaccination should be immediately introduced since a large number of children already suffer from the

Gani Lone's killing to cast a shadow on peace process

The assassination of Abdul Gani Lone, the most vocal moderate voice in Hurriyat Conference, a conglomerate of 23 separatist groups in Jammu and Kashmir, is ikely to cast a shadow on the peace process in the state.

The killing of 70-year-old Lone, a strong proponent of "independent Kashmir", in Srinagar Tuesday comes at a time when he had been increasingly opposing the cult of violence by "jihadis" in Jammu and Kashmir and signaling a return to the process of peace and democratic process in the state. Gani Lone's son Sajjad Tuesday

night accused the Inter-Services Intelligence of Pakistan of being behind the killing of his father. The charge and the elderly politician's death are likely to throw in sharp relief the divisions between moderates and hardliners in Hurriyat leadership over the course of action to chart, especially in view of coming elections to Jammu and Kashmir legislature.

A wave of anger swept Gani Lone's relatives and supporters at his Srinagar residence last night when his body was taken there. Jamaat-e-Islami leader Syed Ali Shah Geelani, a pro-Pakistan hardline Hurriyat leader, faced a storm of protest and was not allowed to enter Lone's house.

Gani Lone was regarded as a mass leader in Hurriyat with sizable following in his home district of Kupwara and parts of Baramullah district.

He had for the last few years been at loggerheads with Hurrivat

The overdue amounts of VAT with those companies were mentioned in the report on the basis of a special audit by the customs, excise and VAT commissionerate (south). It was also mentioned in the

report that some of the companies deposited some amounts and paid up the overdue amounts after the report was published. We have got the discussion at the meeting reconfirmed and VAT

officials clearly said they are going to take 'appropriate actions' against some of the companies if they fail to pay the overdue amounts. The 'appropriate actions' mean

locking the offices and closing down their business activities, said a high official at the customs, excise and VAT commissionerate (south)
