Italian coach, Giovanni Trapattoni has confirmed that Cristiano Doni will be Filippo Inzaghi's replacement in Italy's opening match of the World Cup, should the AC Milan player still be injured. Italy face Ecuador on Monday and should Inzaghi still be unfit, Doni will be placed in a playmaking role behind Francesco Totti, who will be brought forward to partner Christian Vieri

Doni said, "I'm really happy that the coach is considering me. I started my adventure in the Italian jersey here in Japan a few months ago, and I scored, so this is a lucky coincidence. I have the advantage of being a polyvalent player, so I'm ready for every type of tactical configuration against Ecuador. There are no certainties, but I'm hoping for a place. I have made a very important change considering that I came from a less important team like Atalanta. It's only my fault that I only got the chance at the age of 28, but I'm ready now".

Over 54 percent said they bet for excitement, while 35 percent admitted that social pressure by friends and co-workers was a key factor in World Cup

Most forms of gambling are illegal in Thailand but illicit betting on everything from Thai boxing to fish-fighting is rampant

#### **EUROPEAN RIVELINO!**

Football's World Cup should never be allowed out of Europe again, according to Brazilian legend Rivelino. The veteran of Brazil's great Cup-winning side of 1970 has called for a

more realistic approach from football's world governing body, FIFA, over the allocation of the sport's global showcase.

"The World Cup should only ever be played in Europe and nowhere else,"

"It is the only continent which has the infrastructure and the atmosphere to stage it successfully. Not even Brazil can do that."

Rivelino dismissed suggestions that holding the present tournament in Japan and South Korea would open up a whole new market for the game.

He was equally scornful of African claims to stage a future tournament and even spoke out against South America again providing the setting for the world's greatest sporting spectacle.

On the subject of co-hosting the World Cup finals, Rivelino said the idea was badly conceived.

"There is no World Cup atmosphere in Korea." he said.

Rivelino, a key midfield component behind the 1970 triumph which gave Brazil their third World Cup and outright ownership of the Jules Rimet Trophy, is in South Korea as a commentator for a Brazilian cable TV station
