While some World Cup coaches have barred players from sex during the one-month tournament in Japan and South Korea. Jomo Sono of South Africa is not about to douse the passions of his squad.

Reports here guoted Sono saying he had no intention of controlling the sexual urges of "grown men" ahead of Group B matches against Paraguay, Slovenia and Spain.

"Even if I were to ban the players from having sex while in camp, I'm sure they would sneak out and go looking for it," former national star Sono told The Star.

"But these are professional players and I believe they will do what is in the best interests of the team. They know how much the World Cup means to our people back home.

Sono said the players were welcome to take wives, children and girlfriends to the quadrennial 32nation showcase of international football provided they did not stay at the squad hotel.
