# Sohel murder in Khulna

# Mayor group condemns filing of case against BNP leader Martuza

STAFF CORRESPONDENT, Khulna

The mayor-lovalist group of Khulna City BNP has sharply reacted to the implication of its senior vicepresident Shaharuzzaman Martuza in the murder of Jubo Dal leader

Eight persons including Martuza have been named as accused in the murder case. Sohel was gunned down at 10:30am on Saturday at Koilaghat under Khulna Thana.

Leaders of both city and district convening committees of the party said the real culprits have been not been accused in the case for politically victimising a senior leader of the party with whom Sohel had no political or personal connection whatsoever.

Sohel was allegedly involved in several murders that were not recorded as regular cases due to his political influence and threats given to relatives of victims, said party insiders while strongly conmning filing of the case terming it as false and motivated.


