New naval chief meets President

Smartly attired BN personnel presented guard of honour, naval buglers played the last post and national flag and BN ensign were lowered at half-mast as a mark of respect to the martyred souls at the time of wreath laying.

Senior naval officers and a large number of BN personnel were present on the occasion, says an ISPR press release.

Sujon murder case Police yet to complete investigation

Police are yet to complete the investigation into the death of former BNP MP Shahjahan Howlader Sujon who was murdered nearly a year ago.

The Sujon murder case, however, is enlisted as a priority case and the government has ordered the authorities to bring the culprits to book, official sources said.

Sujon, a former MP (Brahmanbaria-6) of BNP and former vice-president (VP) of Haji Mohsin Hall Students Union of Dhaka University, was killed by some unidentified miscreants in the city on July 3 last year.

CID Inspector Ilias Mia, the Investigation Officer (IO) of Sujon murder case, told BSS that investigation into the case is still going on and he is hopeful of submitting the charge sheet soon.

He said police has so far arrested six people -- Mannan, Habib, Shafiqul, Ziauddin Bahes, Ful Mia and Atique -- for their alleged involvement in this murder. Later, Atique was granted bail.

Principal accused Dr Boushan Alam and three others got anticipatory bail and one is still absconding.

The IO said police has been investigating the case on the basis of circumstantial evidences as there is no witness to this murder.

Police have been suspecting that Sujon was kidnapped when he came out from one of his friend's house at Shantinagar and was killed later.

The IO said police have gathered some important evidences, but he did not disclose these for the interest of investigation.

Sujon murder case was filed with Ramna thana on July 3, 2001 under section 302 by Sub-Inspector Tota Mia. Sujon's mother filed another case with Motijheel thana on July 7, 2001 under section 364.

On the fateful day of July 3, 2001 Shahjahan Howlader Sujon came out of his friend's house at Shantinagar at around 8:00 pm. One hour later, he was found with severe stab injuries in his body near the southwest gate of Suhrawardy Udyan.

Sujon was pronounced dead when two rickshaw passengers rushed him to Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

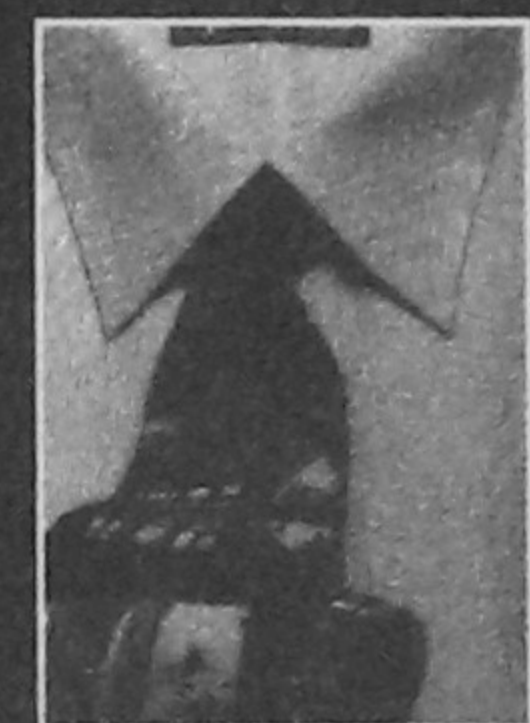
