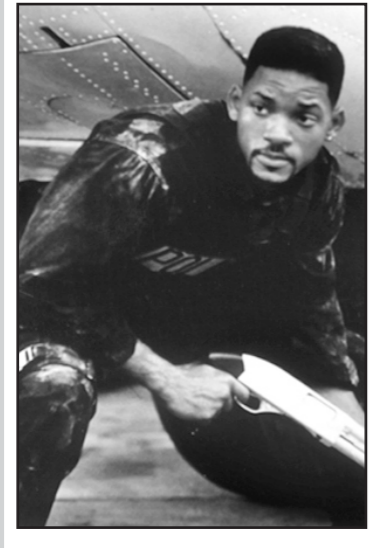
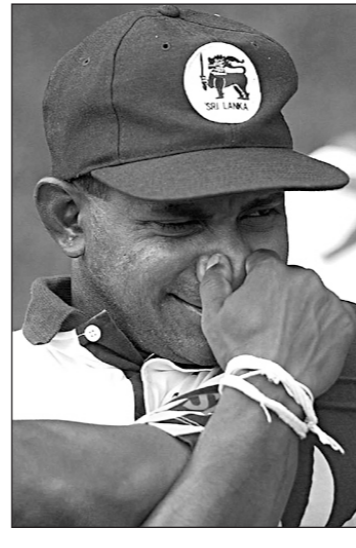

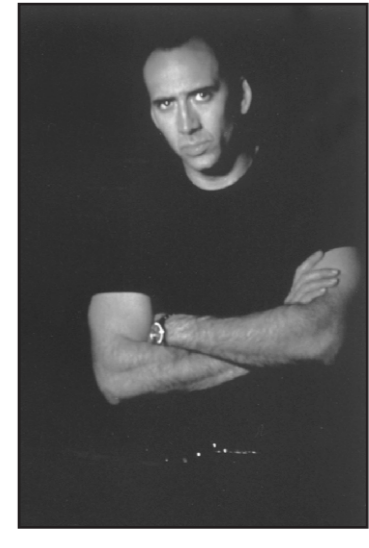
### The Movie

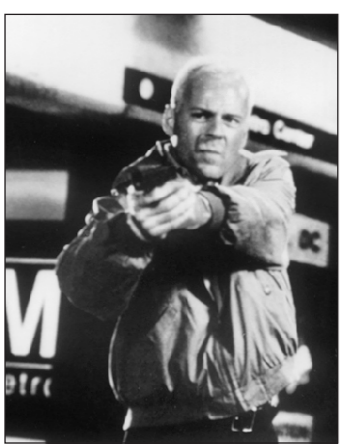

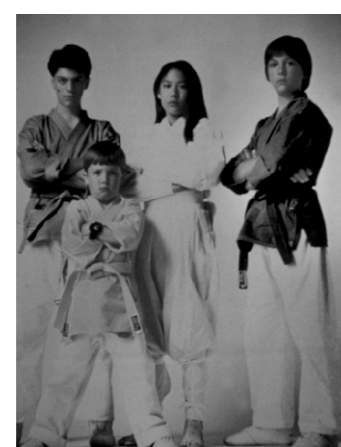

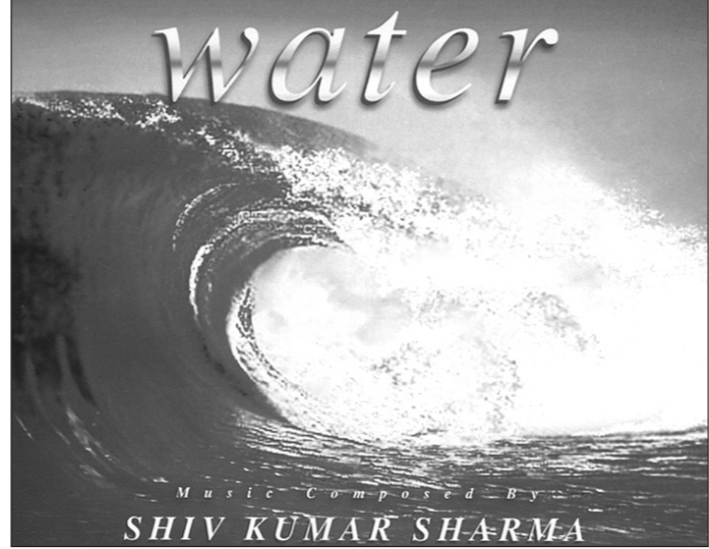


The Jackal, June 12th, at 10:00 PM

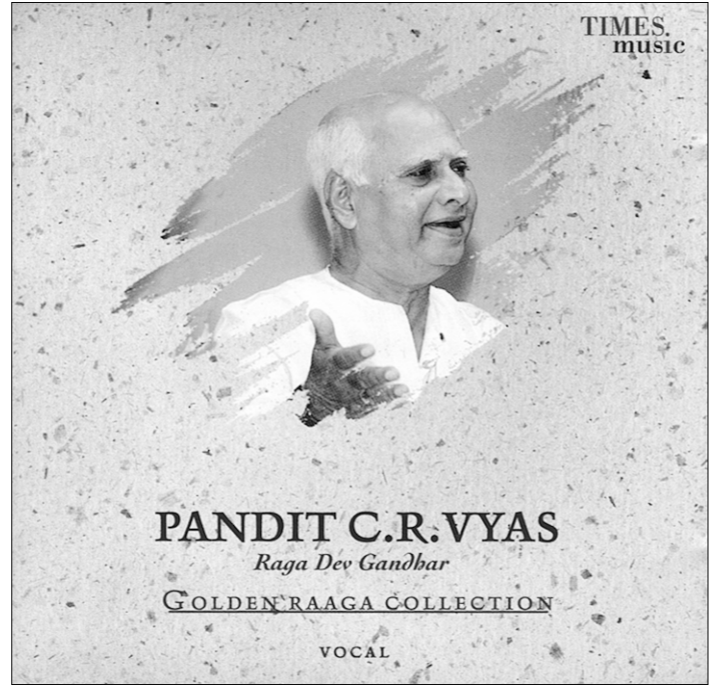


3 Ninjas Kick Back on BHO June 10th, at 10:00 PM

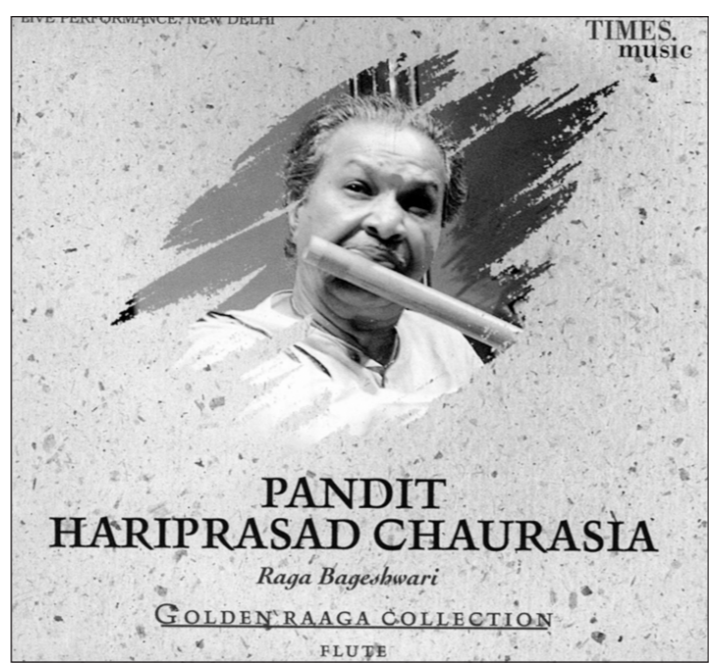
**The Elements of Water**

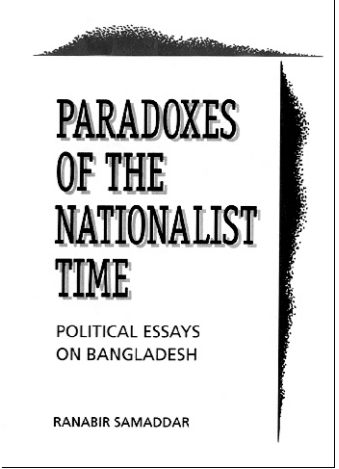
**The Road To The Bazaar**  
Author: Ruskin Bond, Price: Tk 68.00  
Ruskin Bond not only brings to life a town in northern India capturing the scenery, the people the atmosphere - but also shows that children are the same the world over. On a visit to Delhi with his parents, Mukesh spent two crowded hours at the zoo. So, as soon as he got home, he decided that he would have a zoo of his own. Mukesh did not realize the chaos - and the fun - that his plans would bring to the Indian town where he lived.... These characters and others come in and out of the stories in this book. There is the day of 'The Big Race' when we see a closely fought contest between ... three beetles! 'Koki's, Song' describes the almost unspoken friendship between Koki and the boy by the stream, whose plaintive flute-playing so enraptures her.



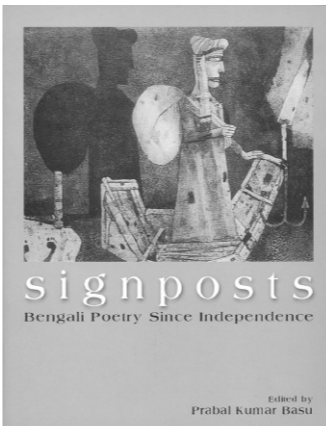
**The House of Blue Mangoes**  
David Davidar, Price: Tk 505.00  
This is a novel about a family, and a village. The two are almost indivisible. The village, Chevathar, is set on the banks of India's southernmost river at the point where it flows into the Gulf of Mannar. It's an idyllic setting, typical of villages on the Coromandel Coast. There are temples, a ruined fort, a church, the big house where the Doral family live, a beach, and groves of mango trees - the blue mangoes of the title. Richly detailed and skilfully narrated, The House of Blue Mangoes is an exuberant first novel that teems with a host of vibrant characters and is shot through with the brilliant colours of the deep south of India.



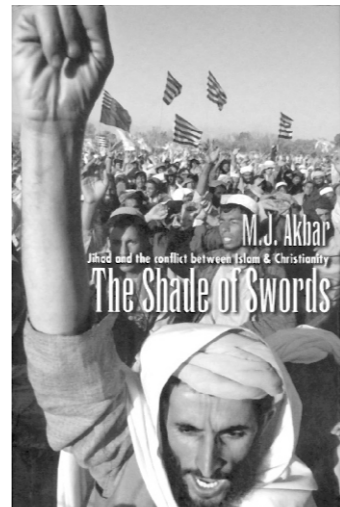
**Rani Kanchan Mala and Other Stories**  
Runa Khan Marre, Price: Tk. 175.00  
Like other Bengali children, the writer Runa Khan Marre heard fairy tales from her old nannies and other household storytellers. Now she has compiled these stories in a simplified English translation for other children to read. Many of the tales are common to both Bangladesh and West Bengal. Some of them may be found in Thakur Ma's Jhuli, compiled by D M Majumdar. Runa Khan Marre's versions are slightly different, being filtered through the several retellings that these stories have undergone. In common with fairy tales everywhere, these stories are about love, jealousy, bravery, loyalty, nobility, meanness, compassion, and, finally about the triumph of truth and patience. Easy enough for young children to read, they may also be read out to children as bedtime stories.



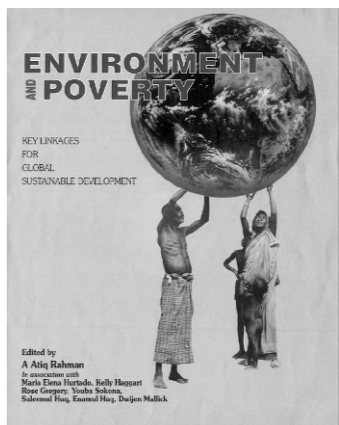
**Paradoxes of the Nationalist Time**  
Ranabir Samaddar, Price: Tk. 300.00  
These essays show that contrary to the widespread belief, nationalism is not all about the celebration of territory as a marker of identity and power; it is also about time in a fundamental way. The anxiety over time is as fundamental as the one over space. Indeed space appears as one in the distribution of the elements that go into making the time of nationalism. The author contends that, each time the nationalist destiny of Muslim Bengal took a clearly discernible turn, it seemed to the actors as final and irrevocable the actors of 1937, 1947, 1954, 1957, or 1971. But in each instance it was a case of time playing with its finally, taunting it, mocking it, bringing forth in front of its final version its earlier and later incarnations. In this sense, the history of nationalism is not something that can be termed as the "the foreshadowing of the nation".



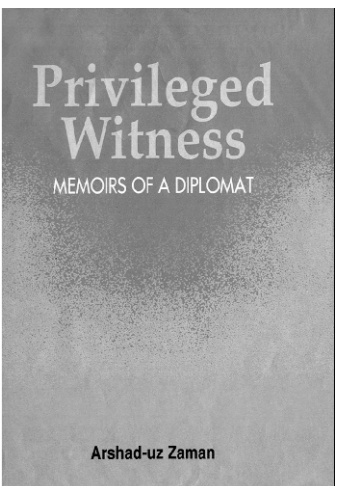

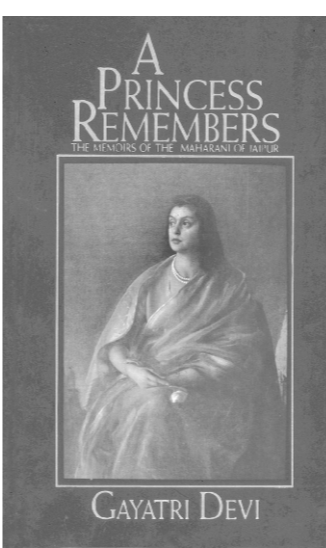
**The Shade of Swords**

The Shade of Swords traces the origins of jihad in the struggle against oppression that was part of the earliest consciousness of Muslims. Travelling across centuries and continents, from the triumphant rise of Islam under the Prophet Muhammad to the depression of defeat in the first Crusade, through the renewal of Saladin to the rise and fall of the Ottoman and Mughal empires and the raw passions of Afghanistan and the Indian subcontinent, M.J. Akbar's gripping story explains how jihad thrives on complex and shifting notions of persecution, victory and sacrifice. The fire that is visible on the Muslim street across the world today is fuelled by a perception of injustice and exploitation by the West. Akbar observed 'It is in the sweep of Islamic nations from the Maghreb to Pakistan that the struggle for a new world order will begin'.



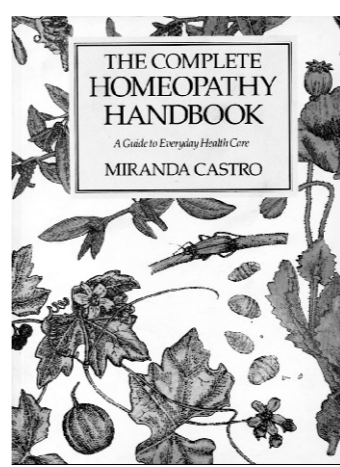
**Environment and Poverty**

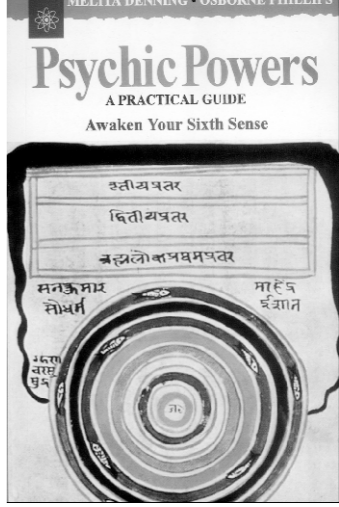
**Privileged Witness**

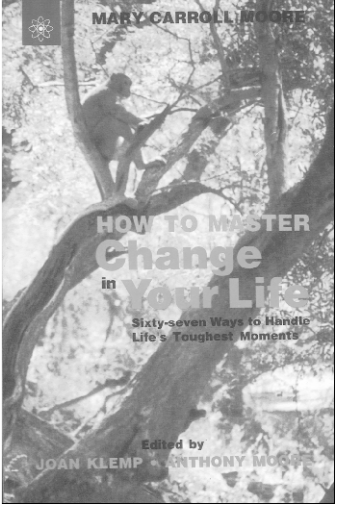
**A Princess Remembers**
