A Spanish affair

Juan Carlos Ferrero looks like the man to beat in Sunday's all-Spanish men's final against Albert Costa at the French Open.

The pair, playing in their first Grand Slam final, will be bidding to follow in the footsteps of Carlos Moya who was the last Spaniard to lift the title in 1998 in another all-Spanish clash with Alex Corretja.

But what should be a classic showdown between the clay court players looks hard to call on paper with two players who stand 2-2 in their previous meetings which have

all been on clay. The 26-year-old Costa came away winner of their last meeting in Hamburg, but Ferrero won most recently at Monte Carlo, when he

defeated Moya in the final. Costa has 11 titles, all of which have come on clay, but has won nothing in the past three years, while Ferrero has six titles, five of which are on clay.

"The last time I lost against Albert in Hamburg, so I'll have to play my best tennis, to try to give my best mentally on court and that's all," said Ferrero. "Nobody's the favourite in the final.'

Barring a recurrence of an ankle sprain which resulted in the 22-yearold Ferrero almost withdrawing from the tournament before his second round match the man from Alicante is tipped as the favourite.

Former champion and seven time Grand Slam winner Andre Agassi, the fourth seed from the United States, believes his conqueror Ferrero will become this year's champion after their quarterfinal meeting.

And Ferrero, the 11th seed, showed his winning form against second seeded Marat Safin which left the Russian wondering just what which the Spaniard won 6-3, 6-2, 6-

'The guy he's playing much better than before," said Safin.

'He's attacking, he's serving well. He's learned a lot and has more experience now. He's won two Masters Series events. He already

made the semifinals last year here." But Safin believes that Costa could be the dark horse of the tournament with consistent good results

"Costa is playing well also. He made results in the clay court season," said Safin.

"He made the quarterfinals at Monte Carlo and the finals in Barcelona and the quarterfinals in Rome. He beat Ferrero in Hamburg. He's a dangerous player.

"I think it's going to be a tough final. And it's a final you never know whose going to be the winner, added former US champion Safin.

Costa, the 20th seed, may be a surprise finalist, but in his match against Corretja, he displayed the form that allowed him to knock off three-time Roland Garros champion Gustavo Kuerten earlier in the tournament.

He committed only 76 errors, compared to Corretja's 92, and was

able to save 16 of Corretia's break point opportunities before clinching a 6-3, 6-4, 3-6, 6-3 win in three hours, ten minutes

The semifinal victory boosted Costa to a career high number five in the ATP Champions Race, and if he wins Sunday, the Barcelonabased player will jump to number two, trailing only Safin.

"It's a great moment for me," said Costa, who has not won a title in three years.

But he knows he has a tough task to get past Ferrero, which has reached the semifinals here for the past three years, losing the past two years to eventual champion "Juan Carlos has a very good


