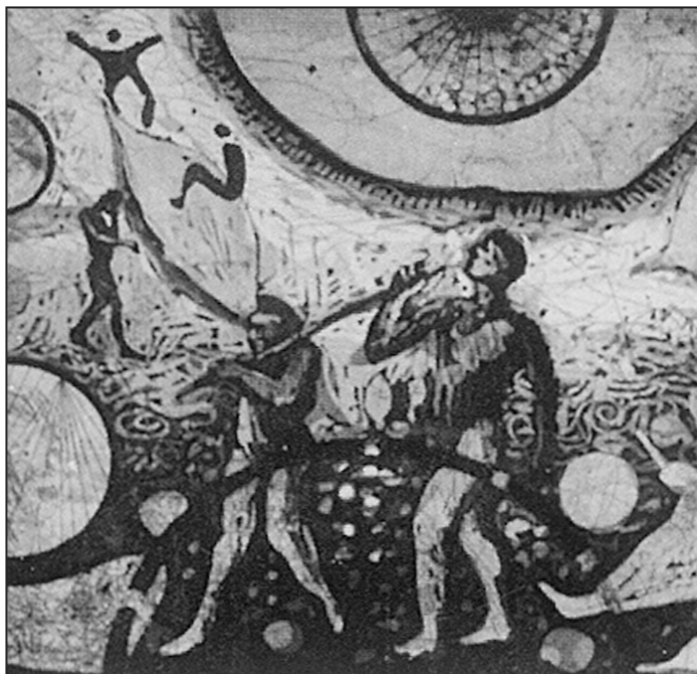
A group of 12 up-and-coming print makers hang their works at a show titled *Printed Matter*. The band of young artists are calling themselves the 'Print Makers Band' and the show is being held at The Zainul Gallery, Institute of Fine Art, Dhaka University. It's a place they are probably most comfortable with, their second home. The exhibition started on June 8 and will run till 14th, everyday from 10 A.M. to 8 P.M.

The members have come together with their different backgrounds. The group consists of teacher, ex-students and students of printmaking. Such notion of unity and working together

provide a positive impression. Group shows have their own traditions and powerful outcomes. It has always worked as gateways, created space for artists who are not well known and have inspired those who have already made their way to the viewers.

The participants of this exhibition are Laila Sharmeen, Matia Banu Shuku, A. Rahman, S.M. Sayeduzzaman Shellym, Ishrat Jahan, Md. Anisuzzaman, Md. Abdus Sobhan Hira, S. M. Upama Sharmin, Roozvelt Benjamin D' Rozario, Khaled Mahmud, Fazl-E- Muntaqim Shaon and Syed Zahid Iqbal.

Each artist has three works for the exhibition and each differs greatly in the way of expression. They have picked subjects from

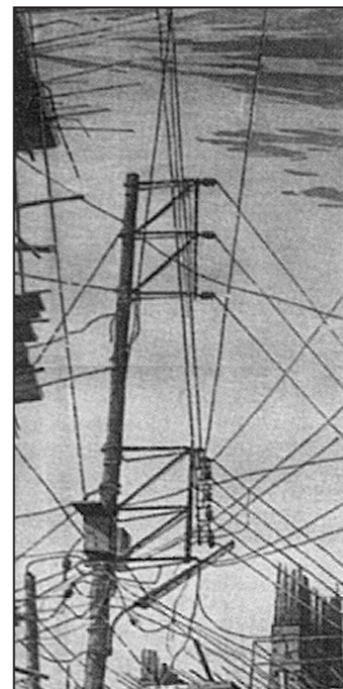


Etching, Abdus Sobhan

different planes of life. Each has applied methods according to his/her own interest, demand and liking. And every viewer can notice distinct individuality in colour treatment, composition and space management as he walks around the gallery moving from the works of an artist to another. All of them have different stands. But what is really interesting at the same time is that with all their differences, they tend to convey a certain common impression. Though very subtly, some similar music can be heard. A strong craving for freedom mingled with compassion underlies every work. The life they have portrayed is our own, the beauty and crisis they have printed is ours too, and the freedom they tried to utter with silence is the freedom that lacks in every sphere of life. The freedom we all crave for. Brief introduction of some of these print makers including the works would explain how they are distinctly individual yet related.

West, are the primary source of inspiration. Two of her works are result of the influence and relation of Greek mythology and ancient Bangla literature in her life. Describing one of her work *Narcissist*, Laila reveals how self-love is connected with the whole existence and how that engages an individual in search for an arcadia. Laila's works are the products of that search one that is for divinity within the harsh realities.

Sayed Zahid Iqbal is on the way to construct his own philosophical concepts through the experiences of daily life. To him, love is experimentation as are his works *Fantasy life*. Zahid plays with techniques. He worked in different media within the same flat surface and it gives the subject a more realistic look. With the growth of civilization complexities of every sort have emerged as indivisible part of our life. And every human being have finally become identified with the 'too many faces' and images he carries along with him -- just like

changing masks one after another. Zahid portrayed in his works this fragmented personality of humankind.

Md. Anisuzzaman, a teacher of Fine Art, Dhaka University is already well known for his work. Anis has also chosen a series work for the exhibition with the title *Complexity*. Tremendous ability of space management can be seen in the works. But it would be a mistake if Anis is only appreciated for his technique and composition. Anis is more than an artisan; he is an artist. Everyday, on his way to the Fine Art Institute from the Indira Rd residence he sees huge construction sites. And he does not like the unplanned growth of the city. The never-ending construction of multi stories, which evidently symbolises the inner complexity and lifelessness, are his subjects.

Khaled Mahmud, still a student of print making, perceives life as a continuous process of learning. His exhibits create an immediate impression of completeness

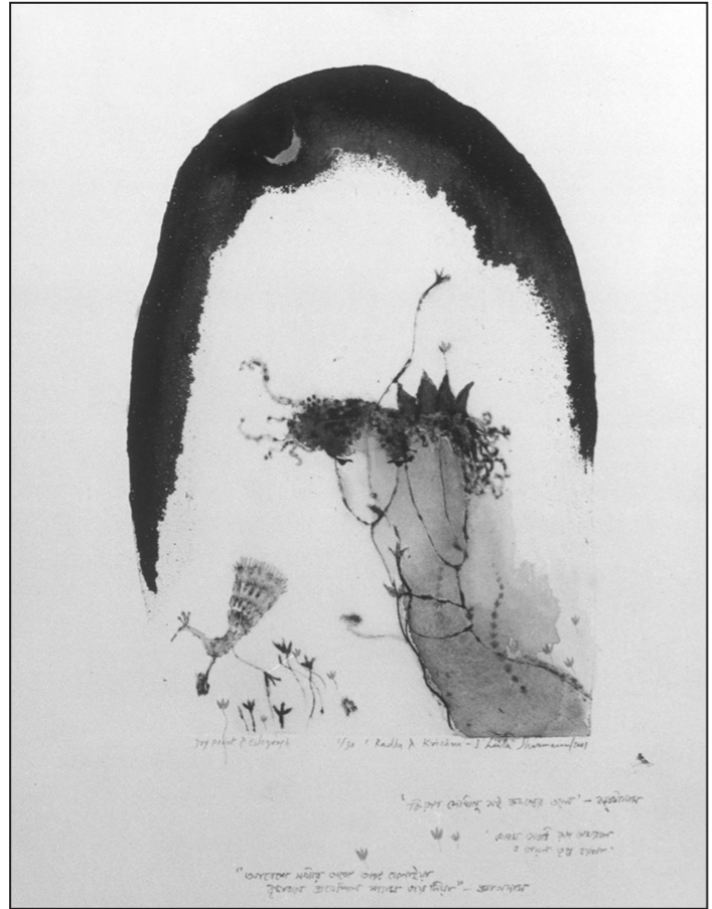

for his style of presentation. Yet there is much to explore in his works. They invite you to go beyond the wooden frames and suddenly find that it is not anyone else but it is you in the picture. You with all your instincts, conscious and unconscious, hidden and exposed. The theme he wanted to convey is *transparency*.

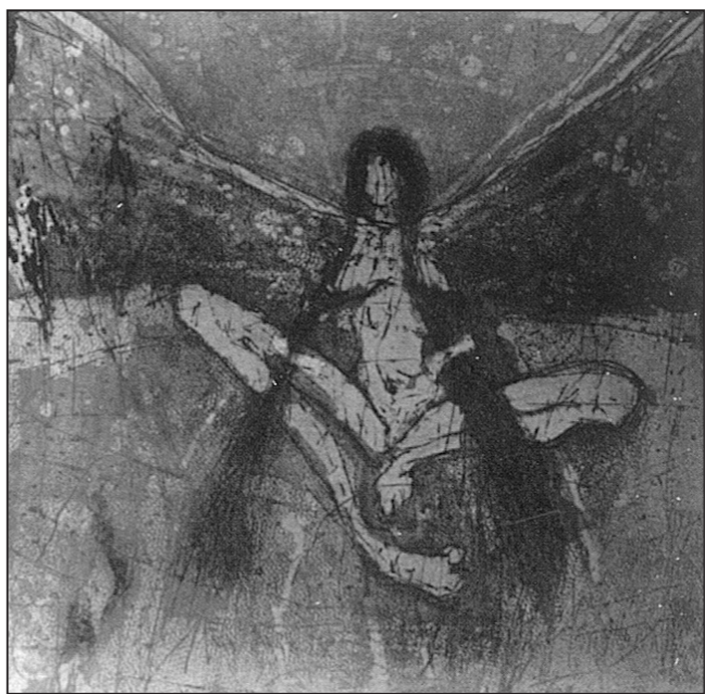
