Although Denmark may have stunned holders France, but they will have few secrets from England according to assistant coach Steve

The Danish squad is packed with experience of English football, led Jesper Gronkjaer (Chelsea), Thomas Gravesen (Everton), Stig Tofting (Bolton Wanderers), Thomas Sorensen (Sunderland) and Claus Jensen (Charlton Athletic).

DENMARK STRENGTHS: Confidence is sky-high after first round wins over Uruguay and world champions France. Denmark's players have a fine collective team spirit, are not hampered by prima donna egos and all appear to have hit form at

DENMARK WEAKNESSES: Striker Jon-Dahl Tomasson, who has scored four goals so far, is doubtful with a groin injury and there are also concerns about combative midfielder Stig Tofting who is nursing a troublesome left foot.

ENGLAND STRENGTHS: Apart from the second half against Sweden England have achieved that they have needed too so far. Their match-winning 1-0 performance over Argentina was their best showing in the World Cup for years and despite the sterility of their 0-0 draw with Nigeria, they did secure the point they eeded to advance. Captain David Beckham is returning to full fitness, defender Rio Ferdinand has looked world class.

ENGLAND WEAKNESSES: A lack of guile in midfield apart from Beckham and the continued reduced potency of Michael Owen in front of goal leaves England with few attacking options. Both their goals so far have come from set-pieces: a corner against Sweden, a penalty against Argentina.

"He is a very extroverted player and he interprets his role in the team very much like I do, except that I don't shoot free kicks or penalties," Kahn said.

Turkey finally did justice to their talent against China. Turkish football is an emerging force in world football, with their clubs as well starting to break through in the European club scene. A good league does not necessarily translate into a good national team, but it certainly helps. As in the other games, the South Americans were let down by poor finishing from their strikers against a Sweden side with excellent discipline at the back. Bielsa must accept some blame for Argentina's debacle. The support striker for Batistuta or Crespo has

always been a naturally left sided player, in the form of either Lopez or Kily.
