Hasina also proposed an obituary reference on the deaths of the common people and the opposition activists who have lost their lives over the last eight months and requested the chair to observe a one-minute silence in memory of the victims.

However, the Speaker, amid the AL's silence move, proceeded to the day's work. The lawmakers belonging to the Treasury Bench and other small opposition parties did not participate in the silence move.

As the main opposition joined the parliamentary proceeding breaking its eighth-month boycott, Acting Speaker Akhtar Hamid Siddigui and the Treasury Bench members as well welcomed the AL's joining.

Leader of the House Prime Minister Khaleda Zia, her deputies in the Treasury Bench and other members welcomed the AL MPs by thumping loudly on their desks.

"Today is the day of joy for the House, I greet the opposition lawmakers," said the acting speaker welcoming the AL lawmakers. Akhtar Hamid Siddiqui took the new charge after the speaker assumed the presidency barely three days ago.

"Like you (the opposition lawmakers) I hope the House would be more lively and functional," he said seeking cooperation from all MPs in running the House smoothly

'Death threat' to Babar

Babul has been instructed to be present at the SB office today for further interrogation.

According to the general diary (GD) filed by the minister, Babul verbally abused Babar and threatened to kill him after he (Babar) opposed issuance of the liquor manufacturing licence to Jamuna Group and was instrumental in canceling it.

Sources said besides intelligence agencies, other instruments of the government have also initiated hectic investigation into the matter and other related aspects.

The finance and commerce ministries as well as their different departments have also begun investigation to find out about the legality of the businesses of Jamuna Group

Extraordinary efforts are under way to gather necessary information related to the death threat, said the sources. The T&T and mobile operators are also busy trying to trace back and retrieve the call between the state minister and Babul.

A high official at the police department said several agencies are working to identify the persons who were with Babul when he made the phone call to the state minister. Legal action would follow immediately after the alleged death threat is confirmed

He said these agencies have already interrogated a number of close associates and business partners of Babul and obtained a lot of information about his businesses

Official sources said Babul might be accused of various charges in connection with business irregularities of the Jamuna Group.

The government has already received a number of complaints from different business establishments about Jamuna Group's "bad deals, non-payment of bills etc.".

Along those lines, Abu Ghaith warned that the United States had not seen the last of al-Qaida in Afghanistan.

"America will realise in the coming months that it got stuck in the Afghan guagmire. In the coming days or weeks. America will have to admit the magnitude of its losses in Afghanistan," he said. He also said that the allied bombing of Afghanistan had little effect on the network, which is still up and running with "98 percent" efficiency.

Graham, meanwhile, warned US citizens to stay alert. "I think there is a heightened level of threat, let's say, in comparison to 30 or 60 days ago," he said.

The ranking Republican on the Senate intelligence committee, Alabama Republican Richard Shelby, agreed on ABC Sunday, saying al-Qaida is "all over the world. They've been trying to regroup. They're going to continue to be a real, real problem. They can hit us any day."
