# Report on gas reserve

Regarding gas resources, the committee is learnt to have accepted the figure of 32 TCF as shown in the United States Geological Survey (USGS) report.

In its reckoning of 50 years as far determination of domestic need is concerned, the committee decided to use the 2000-2050 period instead of 2010-2060.

With 4.5 percent usual growth, the domestic demand of gas during the period will be 64 to 69 TCF indicating that Bangladesh will need to find alternative energy or explore further to have more gas

The committee will show that the 50-year demand at 3 per cent growth rate will be 40-44 TCF while at 6 and 7 per cent, the demand would be 101-110 TCF and 141-152 TCF respectively.

A committee member said their tasks were to determine gas reserves, resources and demand, and now it is up to the government to decide whether or not to export gas.

However, he said, since Bangladesh does not have enough gas reserves even to meet up domestic demand up to the period under consideration, the question of reserves is immaterial in taking a

"Whatever the government decision may be, it has to be on the

basis of financial aspects," he said almost corroborating the suggestions the utilisation committee is

going to make. The utilisation committee wil recommend limited pipeline export saying Bangladesh is not capable of making huge investments for exploring new gas reserves, and that international oil companies (IOCs) are the only alternatives for

But the IOCs will not be interested in making billions of dollars worth of investment if they are not given enough market, a member of the utilisation committee said.

He said Bangladesh also needs to export gas to maintain a balance in foreign exchange reserves after making payments to the IOCs and independent power producers and repaying loans in foreign currency.

# Proposed changes in The hundi route

The Anti-smuggling Task force for Rajshahi region in a meeting at the deputy commissioner's conference room here recently expressed deep concern over the illegal 'hundi' business and recommended tough action against those involved

"Even two years ago, the 'hundi' business was a very secret affair. But now the illegal trade has become widespread in the region. Agents of the 'hundi' traders now do not hesitate to frequently cross the border," said a member of the task force while talking to The Daily During the last one year, there

had been many incidents of robbing agents of the 'hundi' at the frontier areas in Lalpur of Natore, Godagari of Rajshahi, Shibganj and Bholahat of Chapainawabgani; Porsha, Patnitala, Shapahar and Dhamuirhat of Naogaon' Panchbibi of Joypurhat, and Kushmandi. Khanpur, Ramsagar of Dinajpur districts. Armed clashes and murders also occurred during such incidents of snatching away 'hundi'.

Almost all the money for smuggled goods is reportedly paid off through 'hundi'. In some cases, particularly those involving illegal trade of arms and narcotics, smugglers pay the price of the merchandise in gold. And for this reason, shops of gold ornaments have mushroomed in the still underdeveloped areas of Natore, Dinappur and Chapainawabganj districts.

The 'hundi' syndicates have accounts with different government and non-government banks both in the country and India for running The Bangladesh Bank after

conducting a primary investigation in different banks recently has found that 37 businessmen and their organisations in Rajshahi region are involved in the 'hundi' business. Of the 37 businessmen, 21 are from Godagari upazila in Rajshahi and 16 from Chapainawabganj districts.

The list of the 37 businessmen, among many others across the country, has been sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs, National Board of Revenue and to the Bureau of Anti-corruption for further investiga-
