

Tale of Doomsday

NSU photography club and American Center of the US Embassy jointly hold exhibition, 'Terrorism against Humanity', in the city that depicts the aftermath of Sept. 11 terrorist attack

"In time, perhaps, we will mark the memory of September 11 in stone and metal, something we can show children as yet unborn to help them understand what happened on this on this minute and on this day. But for those of us who lived through these events, the only marker we'll ever need is the tick of a clock at the 46th minute of the eighth hour of the 11th day."

President George W. Bush December 11, 2001

The statement was made three months after the terrorist attack on the United States, an exact print of which find place in frame and becomes one of the 28 photographs of American photographer Joel Meyerowitz, currently hung at a display gallery (BTA 100) for an exhibition titled 'Terrorism against humanity' that is on at North South University (NSU) in the city since June 30. The exhibition is organized by NSU Photography Club with collaboration with the American Center of the US Embassy in Bangladesh.

The exhibition was inaugurated by Osman Faruque, Minister in charge of the Ministry of Education, who was accompanied at the event by the newly appointed Vice-Chancellor of NSU, A.B.M. Kamaluddin and the Charge D'



Affaires of the US Embassy in Bangladesh. The same exhibition officially titled 'After September 11: Images from Ground Zero', has so far been displayed by the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs (ECA) of the U.S. State Department in more than 32 cities around the world that would continue throughout the year



in different cities. This is for the second time the exhibition is being held in Dhaka, the first one of which was held during mid-April at DRIK gallery of Dhanmondi. The current exhibition has become possible as the American Center of the US Embassy in Bangladesh has bought copies of entire series of the works.

The purpose of the exhibition is to visually relate the catastrophic destruction of the September 11 attacks and the physical and human dimensions of the recovery effort. The aim is to provide overseas U.S. diplomatic missions with a dramatic exhibit that reminds foreign audiences of the extraordinary extent of the World Trade Center attacks, documents the recovery efforts and portrays the threat terrorism poses to any metropolitan area, a threat that must be combated at all costs.

The Museum and Meyerowitz selected 28 images for the exhibition, which is entitled "After September 11: Images from Ground Zero." The only photographer who has been granted unimpeded access to "ground zero" since September 13, 2001, Meyerowitz is an award-winning photographer whose work is in the collection of the Museum of Modern Art and many other public and private collections in the U.S. and abroad. He takes a meditative stance toward the work and workers at "ground zero," systematically documenting the painful work of rescue, recovery, demolition and excavation.

For Joel, it was sheer luck that had helped him do the series. A day or two after the devastation, Joel was wandering around the Ground Zero site when he picked up his camera to take some snaps. He received expected interception from the security personnel due to the area's status of crime zone and returned home disappointed. He decided to make things change with his professional ability of photography. Within a few days, Joel Meyerowitz was engaged by the Museum authorities of New York to create an archive of the destruction and recovery at Ground Zero and the neighborhood and hence started the mission of the committed photographer.

The photographic archive is ultimately to preserve over 5,000 images those will become part of the permanent collections of the



Museum of the City of New York. The photographs will be used for research, exhibition, and publication. Joel works with a large format camera, which allows for the greatest detail and color reproduction. The Museum plans to mount an exhibition and publish an accompanying catalogue in 2004 as part of the opening of the new Museum of

the City of New York at the Tweed Courthouse adjacent to New York City Hall, six blocks from the World Trade Center site.

The exhibition continues at the NSU gallery from 10:00 a.m. to 6 p.m. everyday till July 4, one that serves as a stunning reminder to audiences of the true dimensions of the attack and the response.
