Canadian envoy sees ample scope for expansion of trade

Outgoing Canadian High Commissioner David Preston yesterday said Bangladesh has great potentials of creating market for its products in his country. Appreciating the quality of many Bangladeshi products, the envoy said there is ample scope for expansion of trade and commerce between the two countries. Preston's observation came during his farewell call on Prime Minister Khaleda Zia. The Canadian envoy requested the prime minister to send trade delegation to Canada to explore access of Bangladeshi goods following the announcement of free access of products from LDCs, including Bangladesh.

Khaleda conveyed her thanks to the Canadian government for announcing quota-free access of goods from LDCs. She recalled

that the issue was discussed with her Canadian counterpart Jean Chretien during the CHOGM in Australia.

David Preston, who served here for three years, described Bangladesh as a liberal, democratic and moderate Muslim country. He said the image of Bangladesh is now brighter abroad.

The High Commissioner informed the prime minister that around 1,000 Bangladeshi students are now studying in different colleges and universities in Canada that offers safe environment and high quality education.

He also disclosed that a Canadian Education Fair will be held in Dhaka in September.

Khaleda conveyed her warm greetings to the Canadian Prime Minister and extended invitation to him to visit Bangladesh. She also recalled Canadian assistance during drought in Bangladesh at the time of late president Ziaur Rahman.

Prime Minister's Political Secretary Haris Chowdhury and Principal Secretary Dr Kamal Siddiqui were present during the meeting.

College student killed at teachers' quarters in Barisal

A college student was shot and chopped to death by unidentified assailants at the teachers' quarters of Barisal Polytechnic Institute on Thursday.

The victim was identified as Galib, 17, son of Siddiqur Rahman and an HSC student of Barisal Government Syed Hatem Ali College. The body was recovered on Friday night and sent to morgue for autopsy.

Police said Galib and his family members went to Nalchhiti three or four days back but he returned home alone on Thursday. His parents returned on Friday night only to find his body at a room.

The assailants locked the main gate of the house after killing Galib.

Reasons behind the killing could not be known immediately. A case was filed but none was arrested.

Int'l Cooperative Day observed
