RAKUB earns Tk 26.22 cr profit

Rajshahi Krishi Unnayan Bank (RAKUB) earned a record profit of Tk. 26.22 cr during the last 2001-2002 fiscal year, official sources said.

Indian goods worth Tk 13.86 lakh seized

Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) personnel of 35th battalion in two separate anti-smuggling drives in Rajshahi seized huge Indian smuggled goods worth about Tk 13.86 lakh on Thursday night, BDR sources said.

Acting on a tip-off, BDR personnel from Godagari BOP conducted a search at Mohishalbari hat area in Godagari upazila at about 3:30 am and seized five sacks loaded with different brands of Indian smuggled medicine worth about Tk 12.76 lakh. None claimed the ownership of the seized goods which was later deposited to the local Customs authorities by BDR. In another drive at Piroipur frontier area in Charghat upazila at about 12.15 midnight BDR personnel from Charghat BOP seized 1100 bottles of phensidyl worth about Tk 1.10 lakh but none was arrested in this connection. The

Artificial crisis of iodised salt

Many people in 16 northern districts of the country are suffering from various diseases due to deficiency of iodine.

According to report of World Health Organisation (WHO) about four lakh people in 16 districts including Nilphamari, Rangpur, Gaibandha, Panchagarh, Dinajpur, Lalmonirhat, Chapainawabgani, Rajshahi, Thakurgaon, Pabna, Kurigram are suffering from goitre and other diseases due to the reason. About 15 thousand people in Siraigani are suffering from goitre, the report added. The report also says that iodised salt is hardly available in the markets of these districts. Moreover, people prefer to buy noniodised salt as per kg normal salt is sold at Tk 6 while iodised salt at Tk 10. It is alleged that a section of dishonest traders create artificial crisis of iodised salt in the market to earn windfall profit. Besides, people are not conscious about the utility of iodised salt.

11 including 7 women injured in clash

upazila, three out of eight unions in Barhatta upazila and six unions of Khaliajuri upazila have gone under five to seven feet water.

Road communication between the district headquarters and Durgapur upazila Sadar has been disrupted. Satpai, Goruhatta, Bilpar Nagra areas have gone under three to four feet water.

Some local elite complained that



Malaria claims 242 lives in 6 months in 3 hill dists

The killer disease, Malaria that broke out in an epidemic form in three hill districts, claimed lives of 242 people and affected about 1,12,000 others during the last six

Health department sources said, children and women were the worst affected and the victims died within 24 hours of the attack.

The treatment is being seriously hampered due to shortage of doctors and insufficient supplies of medicine, locals said.

According to hospital sources, in Khagrachhari about 94 people died of malaria in eight upazila hospitals and private clinics during the period.

About 33,000 others were afflicted with the disease and they got treatment from different hospitals and private clinics.

Eightyone people died in 10 upazilas of Rangamati and 42,000 others were affected during the same period. In Bandarban about 67 people

died in seven upazilas. During the period about 37,000 people were affected with the disease Local leaders and public repre-
