AFP, Melbourne Former Australian Test pace bowler Paul Reiffel is to take up cricket umpiring and will be fast-tracked into officiating in first-grade club matches here.

Reiffel, who played 35 Tests and 92 one-day internationals for Australia, will turn to umpiring as part of an Australian Cricket Board nitiative to attract former players into the umpire ranks.

"The main thing was getting my head around being an umpire which is not something that you grow up really wanting to be, you want to play," Reiffel said here on Wednesday. "But once my playing days were

finished I always thought that I wanted to stay involved with cricket and the umpiring avenue is good timing for me." Reiffel, 36, retired midway through last season as Victoria's all-

time leading wicket-taker. He then tried out officiating in a lower grade local club match and enjoyed the experience.

Ronnie Irani was the star of the show as England beat India by 64 runs in their triangular tournament one-day international here at The Oval on Tuesday

Irani, out of international cricket for five years before this series, tore the heart out of India's innings, taking career best one-day international figures of five for 26 as Sourav Ganguly's men suffered their first defeat of the tournament

And, in what was a dress ehearsal for Saturday's tournament final between these countries at Lord's, Essex all-rounder Irani top scored with 53, his first half century at this level, in England's 229 for eight.



The United Cricket Board announced at the weekend that players at provincial and national level would from now on be selected on merit and that at provincial B level guidelines recommending 50% of the team be non-white and one black player be selected would be adopted. And Border, who has not been

afraid to criticise South Africa in the past, has come out in support of the change "I don't like the idea of a quota

system and I think if any young black kids are picked because of their colour it is a bit hollow," he told supercricket.co.za.

"You want to get there on merit. As long as they system is in place to get equal opportunities - and cricket has been at the forefront of all that in South Africa for many years then that is a step in the right direction


