Frenchman Bruno Metsu, who guided Senegal to the guarter-finals of the World Cup, has struck a precontract agreement to coach Emirati club Al-Ain, the club's general secretary said on Thursday.

"We have struck an agreement in principle with Metsu for him to head the coaching staff of Al-Ain next season," Sulaim Suroor al-Shamsi told AFP. "He gave a positive response to
