



Australian football indulged in some deep soul-searching just hours after the shock 1-0 defeat by New Zealand in the Oceania Nations Cup in Auckland.

Ryan Nelson's winner for the Kiwis took them to next season's Confederations Cup in France, and dealt a hefty second sporting blow to their neighbours from across the Tasman Sea.

The Socceroos defeat came just 24 hours after the All Blacks rugby union win over the Wallabies.

Australia, who missed out on a place in the World Cup finals in a play-off against Uruguay, will need to completely overhaul their game, according the acting Soccer Australia chief executive Greg Bates Bates slammed Soccer Australia for a lack of planning, which sent a squad of home-based players to New Zealand completely unprepared

He claimed Soccer Australia's precarious financial position placed coach Frank Farina in an embarrassing position.

Australia's participation in the tournament was in doubt until a few days before the tournament.

Overseas stars such as Leed United pair Harry Kewell and Mark Viduka were told they would not be paid to fly back, and would only get expenses.

Despite Farina picking a thirdstring squad of home-based players, Australia were still expected to win the Oceania Nations Cup, and with it a potential money-spinning trip to France next year to play in Fifa's Confederations Cup.


