According to local political leaders and the chairmen of Fakirhat union parishad, SI Altaf was a terror to terrorists as he led all the operations against them since joining Chulkati police camp on July 26 last

The killers followed the police team to snatch Quddus while he was being taken to Fakirhat thana from Khalishpur. As the snatching bid failed, SI Altaf was murdered, said a high official of Bagerhat district police.

The murder of a police officer by terrorists has created a sensation and panic among people in Bageraht district. Several hundred men and women brought out a procession at Bagerht town yesterday protesting rise in murders and

The body of SI Altaf Hossain has been sent to his village home at Arhpara in Jhenaidah for burial. A case has been recorded with Fakirhat thana with OC as the complainant.

Dr Hossain, a former DG of BIDS, pointed out despite holding enormous potentials of job generation for ever-increasing population, the RNF sector obtained only 11 percent of its initial capital as loans from commercial banks and another three percent from NGOs.

"Most of the capital for setting up the business enterprises was financed by own savings. Thus, mobilization of surplus from the increase in agricultural productivity appears to be the initial building block for the development of the rural non-farm enterprises," Di Mahabub Hossain mentioned in his paper adding that lack of access to credit appeared to be a major constraint to the expansion of RNF enterprises. In their paper, Sattar Mandal

and Asaduzzaman, said, "In 1995/96. RNF contributed 36 percent to the country's total GDP compared to about 31 percent by agriculture. RNF sector grew at 6.8 percent per annum, while overall GDP grew at 4.5 percent a year." They identified four key constraints to RNF sector develop-
