Several thousand students of primary and high schools in the district brought out a procession at the district town yesterday, demanding exemplary punishment to the 'killers' of fellow student Sadia Sultana Trisha, 12.

Besides, a nearly one kilometrelong human chain was formed at the town yesterday in protest against increasing criminal activities which resulted in the tragic death of the girl here on Wednesday. The human chain was organised by the Gaibandha Nagorik Committee.

The Prothom Alo correspondent of Keranigani is still hiding from ruling party hoodlums. Mohammad Igbal Hossain Ratan, was abducted by the goons on July 9, and after being tortured, was left near the Buriganga in an unconscious state.
