The forum leaders said Dr Iqbal made ATAB a family organisation and election of the association could not be held in the last seven years because of his reluctance. Besides, a fund amounting to around Tk 25 crore has now been missing and no audit was made in the past 12 years, they added.

Although there are around 1700 travel agents, many of them had not been made ATAB members, they said, adding that the membership was awarded at Dr Iqbal's will.

### SEC to probe Cheney's corporate misdeed

US Securities and Exchange Commission Chairman Harvey Pitt said Friday his agency would thoroughly investigate any potential corporate wrongdoing in response to questions about Vice President Dick Cheney's tenure at Halliburton

Asked if an independent counsel should be appointed to probe Cheney's role at Halliburton, Pitt replied: "No one in this country gets a pass. I don't care what their status is. We will ferret out wrongdoing

wherever we find it."

The SEC is investigating certain accounting practices that occurred at Halliburton, an oil services company, during Cheney's time as CEO.

Cheney left the company in 2000 to join President George W. Bush's campaign for the White House.

The SEC chairman, talking at the National Press Club here, also said that any hints by Bush about Cheney and Halliburton "went over my head," and he reiterated that he has no intention of resigning from office
