Bangladesh's next high-profile sporting engagement is the 15th Asian Games in South Korean City of Busan in September. Who knows how many athletes and swimmers are now planning to exploit the poor green-red national flag for their petty fortune ride?



Knight said that while it was always possible for an individual to get on to the field of play" he could not explain why none of the 500 stewards or indeed any of the numerous police officers around the ground had failed to apprehend the intruder before he reached the top of the pavilion steps. "We don't rush out and tackle

"But clearly we need to get people to a person as soon as possible. "And from what you are saving it sounds as if we were a bit slow." Knight told reporters. "We need to look at that."


