SPDC, and those who are not. The 'clearance' process is slow, according to the camp-incharge Salauddin Chowdhury. Only three to four families are 'cleared' each week by the SPDC,

he says. At this rate it would take at least nine years for repatriation of the remaining refugees. According to Chowdhury, the

SPDC 'cleared' 2,402 refugees in 1995 but have since gone back on that promise, claiming that they needed to 're-verify' their legitimacy as citizens of Myanmar. As a result, the repatriation process has slowed down to a trickle.
