





# India in ICC dilemma

McMillan and Matt Horne, along with Leading Indian players are yet to leg-spin bowler Brooke Walker have sign a crucial International Cricket asked not to be considered for next Council (ICC) contract, forcing the month's one-day international national cricket board to withhold tournament as the Kiwis seek to the announcement of the squad for defend the title they won in Kenya in next month's Champions' Trophy in Sri Lanka. Australian Cricketers' Associa-

The ICC contract bars players from endorsing products conflicting with the interests of the tournament's authorised sponsors.

"I am not announcing the team as our players have still not signed the ICC contract, which is required to be signed by all those selected for the event," Niranjan Shah, secretary of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), said on Monday.

Shah said if the Indian players refused to sign the contract, they could be dropped for the tournament, which would lead to a major

controversy ahead of the 12-nation one-day event scheduled from September 12-29.


"We have selected the 14 and we are moving as per schedule, but we will not declare the team till the players sign," he added after a selection committee meeting.

"It could come to the players being dropped. We are a part of the ICC, we don't want to confront them.

The ICC's "conflict of interest" contract with Test countries also bars team sponsorships 30 days before and after ICC events.

The contract bans team and player endorsements by companies in the same line of business as ICC's sponsors for major events like the Champions' Trophy and the 2003 World Cup in South Africa. The ICC had set a deadline of

August 12 for the players to sign the contract but Shah said he had heard "unofficially" that the deadline had been extended until Friday.


