## Cash supports **Hewitt**

Former Wimbledon champion Pat Cash has voiced his support of Lleyton Hewitt, describing the ATP's insistence that the world No.1 do a pre-match interview as ridiculous.

The feisty 21-year-old Australian faces a 103,000 dollars fine by the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) for not fulfilling his media commitments at the Cincinnati Masters tournament earlier this Hewitt is appealing against the


