Seven to suffer life-term in murder case

A court here has convicted and sentenced seven people to life term rigorous imprisonment in a murder case.

The convicts were identified as Manoranjan Halder, Shushil Mistri, Gopal Chandra Haldar, Matilal Haldar, Nirmal Chandra Haldar, Goutam Haldar and Jagadish Haldar of Kapurkati village in Šadar upazila. They were tried in absentia.

According to the prosecution, the convicts called their neighbour Makhanlal Shikder out of his house on June 11, 1999 and killed him.

After examining the records and witnesses, the Additional District and Sessions Judge handed down the

Erosion renders 500 famililies homeless in Faridpur

Fresh areas in Sirajganj flooded, situation improves in Pabna, Bogra

Low-lying areas of Sirajganj have been flooded afresh as the Jamuna burst its banks due to heavy rains and onrush of water from across the border while flood situation has been improving in Pahna and Bogra

UNB from Sirajganj reports: Officials said another flashflood hit Sadar, Chowhali, Belkuchi, Shahiadpur and Kazipur upazilas, leaving hundreds of people marooned.

Meanwhile, erosion by the river has taken a serious turn as some 100 dwelling houses went into its gorge in two days rendering hundreds of homeless.

The worst affected areas are Char Delua, Majuakandi, Shohagpur and Randhunibari in Belkuchi upazila, Koijuri, Sonatali, Gala and Jorjana of Shahjadpur upazila, Sodia Chandpur, Birampur and Shool in Chowhali upazila, Khas Rajbari, Tefani, Meghai and Natuarpara in Kazipur upazila, and Mesra, Mallikpara and Bhatpiari in Sadar upazila.

Our Faridpur Correspondent says: Over 500 families of different villages in two upazilas Sadarpur and Char Bhadrasan have been rendered homeless while a vast-tract of crop lands have been eroded by the Padma and the Ariyal Kha during in last three months beginning from June.

Some erosion victims are getting wheat or rice through VGD cards and some are not getting, the affected people told this correspondent who visited the erosion recently affected

BSS from Pabna reports: Floodwaters have started receding from Pabna leaving a trail of devastation.

According to unofficial account, 2,03,156 people of 36 unions in six upazilas have been affected by the flood causing damage to standing crops and property worth about Tk 70 cr.

District flood control room sources said the flood waters have damaged standing crops on over 3,638 hectares of land completely and 8671 hectares of land partially.

A total of 3,079 dwelling houses have been damaged completely while 10,014 more houses partially by the flood.

Besides, onrush of waters have washed away 75 kilometres of road completely and 268 km partially, 5.5 km of embankment completely and 33 km partially.

In all seven educational institutions have been damaged completely while 123 others partially.


Relief materials including food grains and money distributed among the flood-affected people are insufficient, flood

So far 170 metric tons of rice, cash Tk 1,20,000, 700 pieces of sarees, 700 pieces of lungees have been distributed by ministers and local parliament members among the flood affected people. BSS adds from Bogra: District administration has so far distributed about 255 metric ton of rice and 700 pieces of lungees among the flood victims.

Flood victims of six upazilas Bogra sadar, Shariakandi, Shonatola, Sherpur, Dhurat and Gabtali -- received the relief

Flood situation in Bogra started improving day by day, but the water level in the Bangali river has still been flowing about 29 centimeters above the danger mark.

Farmers practise organic farming











Soil fertility has been decreasing very fast due to indiscriminate and unwise use of chemical fertiliser by the farmers in Jhenidah. This has created an alarm among the growers. But a Nongovernmental Organisation (NGO) in Jhenidah with the active support of EU, FAO and Cotton Development Board (CDB) has come forward to help the cultivators overcome the problem. The NGO organised the local growers recently who attended a field day programme at village Kastosagra in Jhenidah Sadar upazila. There they practised the art of organic farming by preparing compost with banana plants, cow-dung, grass and wastage. Alarming rise in early marriage in Narail

boys and girls.

The number of early marriage and divorce has been increasing in an alarm-

ing proportion in Narail, especially in rural areas. As per government rules, a girl is fit for marriage at the age 18 while a young man at the age of 20. But the girls between the age of 12 and 15 and

boys ranging from 15 to 18 have been marrying rampantly in the rural areas. The marriage registrars allegedly record the age of immature boys and girls as 20 and 18 respectively in the registers in exchange of gratification. According to a survey by a non-government organisation, these types of

marriage are mostly being solemnised for dowry or for protecting the chastity of adolescent girls from criminals. In some cases, a section of affluent people usually marry the poor girls as substitute for housemaids, the report said adding about 50 per cent of the early marriages are solemnised following love affairs among the immature

The survey report said about 50 per cent of marriages are registered in irregular ways while the rest 50 per cent remain unregistered.

In case of unregistered marriages, the divorced wife does not get any legal aid. The married underage girls are mostly subjected to physical and sexual harassment leading to rampant divorces.

AL office ransacked: 20 BNP men sent to jail

A court here Monday sent 20 BNP leaders and workers, including a ward commissioner, to jail hajot, cancelling their bail granted earlier in AL office ransacking case.

They were chargesheeted in the case under Explosive Substance

According to prosecution, the accused exploded bombs during the attack on the Awami League office at Natun Rasta crossing in the town on January 27, 1996.

The BNP men, including ward commissioner Khairuzzaman Khoka, president of Sechchasebak Dal Fazle Halim Liton, general secretary of Bastuhara Dal Ashraf Hossain and JCD leader Sohel Mollik, appeared before court and prayed for bail.

The court has fixed August 18 for pronouncing the verdict in the case.

85 killed in road accidents in July in 14 dists

Eighty five persons were killed and 208 others seriously injured following a total of 53 road accidents during the month of July in 14 northern districts

According to police sources, two persons were killed in two separate accidents in Joypurhat, 24 were killed and 48 others seriously injured from 12 accidents in Bogra, eight persons were killed and 17 injured in four accidents in Sirajganj, four killed and 24 injured from three mishaps in Pabna, two killed and five injured from two accidents in Naogaon, 17 killed and 66 seriously injured in three accidents in Raishahi. 10 killed and six injured from nine accidents in Natore, two killed and 20 injured from four accidents in Gaibandha, two killed from two accidents in Dinaipur, five killed and 17 injured from three accidents in Rangpur, two killed from two accidents in Nilphamari, two killed and four injured from three accidents in Kurigram, three killed from three accidents in Thakurgaon and two killed and one person was injured from an accident in Panchagarh during the

Sixty persons were killed and 70 injured in April, 78 killed and 150 injured in May and 42 killed and 65 injured in June last in the northern districts from a total of 163 road accidents.
