# Corruption at cow corridors Govt deprived of Tk 50 cr revenue a year

The government is being deprived of Tk 50 crore in revenue every year from cow corridors in borders of the greater Rajshahi division due to negligence and corruption by a section of customs officials and BDR.

Official sources said local customs office earned Tk 44.11 crore from 10 cow corridors in Rajshahi division in the last fiscal year.


