THE JET AGE: MAL entered the jet age with the Bristol Britannia in 1962 and five De Havilland Comet 4s in 1963. With the formation of Malaysia in 1963, the airline was renamed Malaysian Airways Ltd. Two years later, Borneo Airways Ltd. merged with MAL, increasing both the car-

rier's fleet and network. On the separation of Singapore from the Federation of Malaysia on August 9, 1965, the governments of Malaysia and Singapore took over majority control of the airline from BOAC and the other shareholders. Within the year, the airline became known as Malaysia-Singapore Air-

A new-look airline took off with a moon-kite logo on October 1, 1972, as the national carrier of Malaysia. Together, these flagship Applications will jumpstart the development of the MSC, provide business opportunities for ICT companies especially Malaysian ICT SMEs and spearhead the transformation of the Malaysian society into a knowledge society.

The technological achievements and breakthroughs of the MSC and Malaysia can be seen in both the public and private sectors. In the public sector, the Malaysian technological achievements are best exemplified by the progress of the Electronic Government (EG) Flagship Application and the Government Multipurpose Card (GMPC) Flagship Application. The EG is now being implemented and one of its key component, the Electronic Procurement is boosting the e-commerce activities in the country by connecting more than 30,000 suppliers to the Government as the government forges ahead with the procurement of products and services electronically. The Government Multipurpose Card (GMPC) or MyKad as it is known locally has also been launched and is now used by approximately 2 million citizens in the Klang Valley. MyKad contains not just national identification but also the person's driver's licence, passport, basic health information and a cash component. MyKad is the first smartcard in the world with Public Key Infrastructure (PKI) security features built in for security and to facilitate ecommerce.

"In the recent CeBit 2002 in Hannover, Germany, both Flagship Applications attracted tremendous interest and praise for its cutting-edge technologies and sophistication," said Tan Sri Dato' Dr Othman Yeop Abdullah, Executive Chairman, Multimedia Development Corporation, the organization that was mandated by the Malaysian Government to develop the MSC.

"The interesting phase is just about to start as we begin rollout of the Flagship Applications to the rest of the country and see the success stories of the Malaysian ICT companies," he

Tan Sri Othman said, "The MSC has become the regional launch site for up to 697 local and international MSC status companies to date developing or using leading multimedia technology, allowing these innovators to harness Malaysia's unique competitive advantages that arise from its multicultural links, committed leadership, and proven track record in developing products and services for regional and global markets."

"More than 30 per cent of the MSC-Status companies are involved in software development and this will boost Malaysia's goal of becoming a technological contributor to the Knowledge Economy.

According to the MDC, targets for Phase 1 of the MSC have been exceeded despite the Asian economic crisis and the current world economic As of 14 June 2002, 697 MSC-status

companies have been approved, of which 50 are of international worldclass stature. By 2003, the number is expected to reach 750 and 70 respectively. Many companies are drawn to MSC status by a 10-point Bill of Guarantees granted to firms that attain MSC status, such as incentives as tax holidays, relaxed employment regulations and ownership requirements.

Sales exports of MSC status companies which engage in businesses ranging from the Internet and software development to content development and networking -- is expected to reach RM1 billion this year.

There are other noteworthy successes as well. One of the two "intelligent cities" created from scratch in the MSC is Cyberjaya -- the residential and business community built in the heart of the MSC, complete with smart homes, broad boulevards, and with a population already approaching 8,000. In May, a Street Mall retail district opened featuring a wide array of eateries and shopping outlets. By the end of this year, some 1-million square feet of office space will be completed in the Cyberjaya Flagship Development Zone. The number of MSC-status firms in Cyberjaya is expected to increase to almost double to 100.

"Malaysia has the strength, the national will and talent to achieve its goals. With the combined efforts of the government, industries and innovative technopreneurs, we have the potential to play a pivotal role in the global and regional technology industry and we invite global companies to join us in the Multimedia Super Corridor," he concluded with a smile.
