### **ETV** files two writs, hearing likely today

Ekushey Television Limited yesterday filed two separate writ petitions with the High Court, one challenging Section 5 of the Telegraph Act 1885 and the other challenging notifications dated August 29, "which curtailed various facilities awarded to ETV Ltd."

The petitions were moved before the vacation bench comprising Justice Khademul Islam Chowdhury and Justice Nazmun Ara Sultana

But Justice Nazmun Ara Sultana was embarrassed to hear the matters as she was one of the judges in the High Court Division which declared the licensing agreement between the government and ETV

Thereafter, the matters were sent to the Chief Justice to constitute another bench to hear and the Chief Justice referred the matters to another vacation bench comprising Justice Mohammad Abdul Matin and Justice S K Sinha.

The matters would come in the cause list today, court sources said

Ekushey Television Ltd, the first private terrestrial television channel of the country, was shutdown on August 29 after the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court dismissed review petitions filed by SEE PAGE 11 COL 3

### Change of guards in Titas trade union office

In a dramatic development, two Bangladesh Nationalist Partybacked unions of the Titas Gas Transmission and Distribution Company Limited took control of the union office, chasing out another union, also affiliated with the ruling

According to sources, the Titas Gas Employees Union (TGEU) and the Titas Gas Sramik Karmachari Union (TGSKU) held a joint meeting yesterday morning.

The joint meeting agitated leaders and supporters of the Titas Gas Jatiyotabadi Sramik Karmachari Union (TGJSKU), who were in control of the union office

However, as supporters of two other unions were greater in number, the TGJSKU men fled the office fearing attack, letting the TGFU and TGSKU leaders take control.

President of the TGEU Fazlul Hug Mollah said leaders of the TGJSKU had escaped fearing attack by general workers and staff

# **BB** showcauses MDs of 4 private banks

The Bangladesh Bank (BB) has issued showcause notices on the managing directors of four private commercial banks in connection with irregularities in sanctioning loans to three business groups.

The BB action came after it found out that the banks had flouted rules and not properly monitored the loans sanctioned to Giridhari Lal Modi and his Uttara Group, Om Prakash Agarwal and the Doel Group.

The BB issued the notices on Monday, asking managing directors of the banks to explain within 15 days why they should not be held responsible for the irregularities, according to central bank sources.

The managing directors, who received the notices, are Mirza Ejaj Ahmed

of One Bank Limited, Anwar Ahmed of National Credit and Commerce bank Limited (NCCBL), Mokhlesur Rahman of Dhaka Bank Limited and Rafiqul Islam Khan of National Bank Limited (NBL).

They could not be contacted despite repeated attempts over telephone

After press reports on the financial scam, the BB started investigation into the bank transactions of Giridhari Lal Modi and Uttara Group, Om Prakash Agarwal and the Doel Group on August 10.

# BSMMUH ransacked, 60 admitted to hospitals doctor assaulted

About 200 rampaging students of Dhaka University ransacked the Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University Hospital (BSMMUH) yesterday afternoon, assaulting a senior doctor and two guards and damaging property following the death of a fellow student.

Dr Afzal Hossain, a neurosurgeon, and two security guards of the hospital were seriously injured during the hour-long assault and ransacking in Block C of the hospital. Patients, attendants and visitors were trapped inside the hospital during the attack. The agitating students broke windowpanes and

The government has banned 12,500 two-stroke three-wheelers out of 18,000 from September 1, with the rest plying until December 31 on a special permission by the Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA).

# misbehaviour with addl secy's driver

# Ruling alliance picks Yazuddin for presidency

The BNP-led four-party coalition last night chose former advisor to the first caretaker government and chairman of the University Grants Commission Prof. Yazuddin Ahmed to run for the presidency.

The Presidential election is slated for September 16. Political Secretary to the Prime Minister Haris Chowdhury announced the nomination at the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) late last night

The BNP Standing Committee met at the PMO with Prime Minister Khaleda Zia in the chair and finalised the nomination Earlier on the day, the prime minister had a meeting with frontline leaders

of the ruling alliance to discuss the matter. The presidency has remained vacant since Prof. AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury was forced out of office on June 21. Since then, Speaker of the Jativa Sangsad Jamiruddin Sircar has been the acting President.

Official sources said the EC has completed all preparations to start the process of the polls from today. Prof. Yazuddin Ahmed was born in a respectable Muslim family in

Munshiganj in 1931. His father was late Moulvi Ibrahim. Prof. Ahmed was an adviser in the caretaker government in 1991. He was also chairman of the Public Service Commission from 1991 to 1993 and chairman of the University Grants Commission from 1995 to 1999. He also held the post of chairman of the Soil Science Department of

Dhaka University and dean of the Faculty of Biological Science of the same

University. He was also provost of Salimullah Muslim Hall
