The car was presented to Tendulkar by Formula One world champion Michael Schumacher on behalf of car manufacturer, Fiat, earlier in the Indian team's tour of England. Tendulkar is making his 100th

a 13-time Grand Slam champion, the 31-year-old American legend beat his 20-year-old compatriot for the first time in three tries. After a year of struggles, Sampras has clearly found his game when it matters most. "He was pretty spectacular when
