3 food officials sent into retirement

Three food officials were sent into retirement on Monday for their involvement in wheat procurement irregulari-

Additional Director General (ADG) of the Directorate of Food Entajul Haque, Regional Controller of Food of Dhaka KA Rob and Regional Controller of Food of Rajshahi Md. Fakhrul Islam faced the action.

A presidential order in this regard was circulated on Monday through the Ministry of Establishment. The official order said with effect from Monday the three officials were sent into retirement in public interest.

The latest government action comes a week after six officials were made officers on special duty (OSDs) on September 2 after they were found involved in gross irregularities in wheat procurement towards the end of the countrywide internal foodgrain collection drive.

The three officials sent into retirement yesterday are among the six made OSD earlier. The other three OSDs

are Private Secretary to Food Minister Mohammad Mohsin, District Controller of Food (DCF) of Mymensingh Kamrul Hasan, and DCF of Bogra Nurul Afsar. Two days later, Director General of the Directorate of Food Abdus Sattar Mia was also made

Earlier, reports of two government-formed official probe committees were submitted to Prime Minister Khaleda Zia on August 20 and 27. In addition to the names of the officials, the probe reports also pointed at some ruling party men for their involvement in the procurement of Indian wheat.

The politicians whose names surfaced in the official probe reports include State Minister for Energy AKM Mosharraf Hossain, BNP lawmakers Helaluzzaman Talukdar Lalu of Bogra, Selim Reza Habib of Pabna, Mujibur Rahman of Kishoreganj, and Khurram Khan Chowdhury and Delwar Hussain Khan Dulu of

Young man slaughtered at Tejgaon

Unidentified elements slaughtered a young man and left his body on the Tejgaon Science College campus in the city yesterday.

Identity of the victim aged about 20 could not be known immediately. He was in full-sleeve shirt and blue trousers.

In the inquest report, police said the victim was gagged and his hands and legs were tied. He was slaughtered with a blunt weapon. possibly in the morning

The body was found between the college building and the boundary wall of the campus.

On information, Tejgaon police recovered the body and sent it to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) morgue. A case was filed in this regard.

Diploma engrs besiege **WASA MD**

Members of the Dhaka WASA Diploma Engineers Association yesterday confined WASA Managing Director (MD) in his office for about two and a half hours protesting what they said illegal transfer of an executive engineer.

They alleged that the MD had transferred an electrical engineer on July 28 and asked him to hand over charge to the executive engineer by August 31. But the former did not do so and tried to get the transfer order

Later, the authorities reinstated him in his previous position and transferred the executive engineer. The electrical engineer concerned failed to run a civil engineering

JS session begins tomorrow

Police gun down JCD leader

A Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) leader was shot dead allegedly by policemen at Rayerbazaar in the city Monday night.

Abul Kashem, 25, also a distributor of the International Herald Tribune and son of Habibur Rahman, was shot at the Martyred Intellectuals' Memorial, when he went there with Motahar Hossain Titu, a professional photographer,

Rahman, a resident of the East Rayerbazaar, told The Daily Star yesterday that his son went out upon a phone call by an unknown

Kashem's relatives quoted Titu as saying that when Kashem went inside the memorial, Sergeant

Khondoker Abu Hasan of the Rayerbazaar Police Outpost arrived there in plain clothes with another

They dragged Kashem out of the memorial. Titu saw another police team heading off to the memorial when he was leaving the place to avoid troubles.

Kashem was admitted to the Pangu Hospital at about 8:45pm with bullet wounds. Police stationed there barred his relatives from entering the hospital. Later, Kashem was shifted to the

National Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases where the on-duty doctors declared him dead at 11:30pm. The doctors said he died from profuse

Bangladesh-UK Friendship Bridge opens

PM's call to keep dev agenda above politics

Prime Minister Khaleda Zia yesterday called upon all to keep development agenda above politics in the interest of national progress.

"We'll have to take the country towards further development and prosperity through concerted efforts by all irrespective of party and opinion," she told the inaugural ceremony of the Bangladesh-UK Friendship Bridge on the river Meghna on Dhaka-Sylhet highway.

In a message on the occasion of inauguration of the landmark bridge, one of the largest bridges built in Bangladesh in recent times, British Prime Minister Tony Blair called it a "fresh milestone in British-Bangladesh relations". He congratulated all concerned on the occa-

Khaleda Zia said development is a tough challenge in the 21st century, and in a country like Bangladesh,

facing this challenge.

The 929-metre-long and 19.6-metre-wide bridge, constructed at a cost of Tk 681 crore under British financial assistance, established direct road communications between the capital and Sylhet-Brahmanbaria

Of the total cost, the government of Bangladesh contributed Tk 397 crore while DFID, the British department of international development, provided Tk 142 crore and Standard Chartered Bank gave a loan of Tk

Terming the bridge a milestone in the country's communications sector, the Prime Minister said development of communications is a vital prerequisite for national development

She said the bridge was renamed 'Bangladesh-UK

One gunned down by **BNP** rivals in N'ganj

One person was shot dead and four others were injured in an attack on a house allegedly by some BNP cadres in Shastapur in Fatullah thana vesterday evening

The dead was identified as Gul Hossain, 55. Sources said two BNP factions -- one led by Puikka and the other by

Rahmat -- have a long drawn rivalry over control of Shastapur area. At 6pm yesterday, a group of BNP cadres led by Rahmat went to the residence of Puikka. Failing to find Puikka home, they sprayed bullets on Gul Hossain, elder brother of Puikka, killing him on the spot.

The ruling party cadres also beat up four family members of Puikka, leaving them critically injured. They are Nilufar, 38, Nazma, 28, Hosne Ara, 22, and Nazmul, 3. They were rushed to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

When contacted, the OC of Fatullah police station admitted the incident. No case was filed with Futullah police station till filing of this report
