The 27-year-old and Australia's Brett Lee are currently regarded the fastest bowlers in the world and will aim to make their impact on the ICC Champions Trophy.

Shoaib said: "It is more important to win matches. I am just here to play the game, not to prove how fast I am. Now I need to focus on how well to manage myself.'





