re-emerging diseases. The WHA comprises representatives from WHO member states.

The director-general, who is nominated by the executive board and elected by member states for a period of five years, heads the secretariat.

Some of the major challenges for WHA in the coming years are reducing excess mortality, morbidity and disability, especially in poor and marginalised populations; promoting healthy lifestyles and reducing risk factors to human health arising from environmental, economic. social and behavioural causes.

Developing health service systems, framing enabling policy and creating an institutional environment for the health sector are also on the WHA agenda, he said.
