The Jahangirnagar University Teachers' Association (JUTA) meets September 15 to decide on an agitation programme, as the university authorities did not take any initiative to meet its seven-point demand within a one-week ultimatum that expired yesterday.

The JUTA demand includes the announcement of schedules of the overdue election of the VC panel, senate, syndicate and deans, resignation of the JU proctor, introduction of law against sexual harassment, withdrawal of police from campus, creating permanent posts for teachers appointed on temporary basis earlier and the release of recently arrested JU students.

Russia has been a major opponent of US action against Iraq. There was no immediate response from Baghdad to Bush's comments, but the Iraqi official press accused Bush of seeking to exploit the UN to legitimise an attack "Bush wants to use the United Nations to implement and confer international legitimacy on his aggressive plots against Iraq after most world leaders came out against the unilateral (military) campaign Washington is preparing to wage," wrote the daily Ath-Thawra, the mouthpiece of the ruling Baath party. Many leaders remain worried about the US plans, including Washington's allies in the war against terrorism launched after the September 11 attacks last year.



The Bush administration has insisted that Saddam has consistently flouted UN resolutions he agreed after the 1991 Gulf War. Weapons inspectors have not been allowed in the country since 1998, and Washington says Saddam has used this time to build or seek a nuclear, chemical and biological arsenal.

Unless the international community acts now. "the first time we may be completely certain he has nuclear weapons is when, God forbid, he uses one," the US president said

And he asserted that Saddam's nuclear program could produce an atomic weapon "within a year" if he acquires the right radioactive materials

In his speech earlier, and with Bush listening, UN Secretary General Annan warned the United States not to usurp UN authority in dealing with Iraq.

Annan acknowledged that the UN Charter gave every country the right to self-defence if attacked. But he said: "When states decide to use force to deal with broader threats to international peace and security, there is no substitute for the unique legitimacy provided by the United Nations

possible, otherwise not," he said. Authorised Officer of Rajuk Mohammad Ali said he had no information about the commercial complex yet. "But we will look into the matter and take proper action immediately after conducting an inspection," he told The Daily Star.

Meanwhile, the PWD has sent to the ministry concerned a list of the 327 unapproved commercial structures in Dhanmondi residential area.

But sources said it is a trick by some corrupt officials of the PWD and the Raiuk to take bribes from the owners of these unapproved structures. "Nothing happens beyond the eyes of the authorities, but things are managed somehow," one source said.
