"The charges have been admited to court without modifications," Munich prosecutor Matthias Musiol told the news agency, denying earlier reports in the German press that Becker had agreed a settlement and would pay back taxes to avoid prosecution.

Prosecutors accuse Becker of withholding taxes from German authorities between 1991 and 1993. They allege that early in his career he told them his residence was in Monaco, a tax heaven, while he was n fact living in Munich.

Becker's lawyers said last year that the Munich tax inspectors has asked their client to pay 12 million

suspended jail term of up to two years if convicted. His trial is scheduled to take place from October 23 to 25 in Munich. The former world number one has been through hard times since



'Bullet' Bob no more

'Bullet' Bob Hayes, the former Olympic gold medal sprinter and star Dallas Cowbovs receiver who was once known as the fastest man alive, died in his hometown of Jacksonville, a hospital spokeswoman said Thursday. He was 59. Hayes, who won two Olympic gold medals at the 1964 Tokyo Games and whose blazing speed reshaped professional football's passing game, died of complications from his battles with prostate cancer as well as liver and kidney ailments, the Cowboys' website said.

"He passed away yesterday (Wednesday) evening at 11:15," Shands Jacksonville hospital spokeswoman Joanna Norris said

Born Dec. 20, 1942, in Jacksonville. Haves gained a reputation as a speedster at his elementary school before moving on to a sterling track career in high school and at Florida A&M University, where he was also a football star.

He was dubbed "the fastest man alive" when he won the 100 metres in Tokyo, with a world record time of 10 seconds flat in a performance at the Olympics that was the highlight of his track career.

Six days after winning the gold standard of speed in the 100 metres, his contribution to the men's 4x100m relay was equally spectac-
