

Example of an expatriate worthy of emulation

A Bangladeshi expatriate living in United Kingdom (UK), has set up a unique example of patriotism by establishing a fisheries project near his village in Moulvibazar.

Usually Bangladeshi expatriates living abroad establish industrial units in Dhaka or Chittagong or construct high-rise buildings and super markets in the two major cities. But Syed Ahmed Mukit is an exception. He has set up a fisheries project where more than 50 unemployed people are working

Mukit, of village Jagatsi in Sadar upazila owns a restaurant in London, UK. He lives there with his family members. But he wants to serve in his motherland doing something exceptional so that he and co-villagers are benefited. He purchased more than hundred bighas of land at his village Banika in Giasnagar Union Parisad (UP) of Sadar upazila. adjacent to his village home and also near to Hail haor (water

At the initial stage he excavated three ponds and started his project named Shaha-Al-Quderia Latifia Fish Farm, After his success at the preliminary stage, he excavated 18 more ponds. The number of ponds now stands at 19. The biggest pond covers 40 bighas of land. He has established a hatchery.

According to Mukit, fish fries are being sold from his project to other fishery owners.

Mukit informed that he invested more than Tk one cr in his fisheries project from his own resource. Though he is now living in UK and operating his restaurant business there, yet he visits Bangladesh in every two months to look after his project. He also revealed that he has a plan to establish a fish processing plant to export processed fish in UK.

Mukit commented that the fisheries project in Bangladesh appears to be more profitable to him than running a restaurant in
