However, the Norwegian study says. "In general, the new discoveries are expected to be smaller in comparison with the existing large discovered gas fields.'

Asked about the difference between the two estimates, a senior Petrobangla official said the Norwegian study has taken into account smaller fields having reserves down to 12 to 15 TCE But the USGS and Petrobangla study did not include gas fields having reserve prospects below 42 TCF, he added.

Considering that the sector needs huge foreign investment, the study suggested linking export with further exploration commitment.

It said the new gas discoveries would need to come on-stream by as early 2014-2017, which may account for one-third to threefourths of gas supply in 2030.
