The illegal terminal for buses on a stretch of Toyenbee Circular Road in Gulistan has made the thoroughfare nearly off-limits to other vehicles over the years. Since about 700 buses are

parked on the 120-foot wide twoway road every day, commuters willing to reach the Chittagong Road have to make a long detour through Motijheel or the narrow road through the park in front of the Bangabhaban.

Sri Lanka crush Australia to reach Trophy final

Sri Lanka powered their way into the final of the ICC Champions Trophy with a crushing seven-wicket win over world champions Australia in the second semifinal at the Premadasa Stadium here yesterday.

Superior in every area, Sri Lanka bowled out Ricky Ponting's side for 162, their lowest ever score batting first in meetings between the two, and then knocked off the runs with 10

It was a humiliating defeat for Australia in the first meeting between the teams in three years and just six months before they defend the World Cup in southern Africa

For Sri Lanka, the win meant a place in Sunday's final against India, both those sides vying to win the title for the first time

Friday's match turned in more ways than one on Sri Lanka's reliance on spin bowling, with five slow bowlers used by the home side, and Australia's inability to cope with it on a surface that offered significant turn but was by no means unplayable.

Australia made a flying start after Ponting won the toss with Adam Gilchrist (31) and Matthew Hayden (13) rattling up 49 inside seven overs
