She stepped into politics during her student life when she became vice president of Eden College Students' Union in 1965. She graduated from Dhaka University in 1973. Hasina was married to renowned nuclear scientist Dr MA Wazed Mia in 1968. They have a son and a daugh-

The witnesses are commander Moslemuddin, the complainant of the case and General Secretary of Kolaroa thana Awami League, local journalist Abu Ahmed, B M Nazrul Islam, former MP of Awami League and engineering Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, acting convenor of the district Awami League.

The statements were taken at Satkhira DB (detective office) office for 'security reasons'

On August 30, alleged rulings party armed cadres attacked the motorcade of Sheikh Hasina at Kolaroa, some 18 kilometres off the district headquarters at about noon when she was going to Jessore after visiting a rape victim at Satkhira Sadar Hospital.

The government is contemplating issuing a directive to the authorities of Viqarunnisa University to shift the institution from the premises of Viqarunnisa School and College.

"If it (Viqarunnisa University) fails to return the land and funds of Viqarunnisa Noon School and College (VNSC), the ministry might go for stringent measures," a high official of the education ministry told this correspondent.

He said the Bureau of Anticorruption (BAC) is probing the alleged irregularities done by transferring the land and funds of VNSC during setting up of the university.

"Following a request by the present managing committee of the school, the ministry asked it to take necessary steps to get back its land and funds." the official said.

He said the education ministry would also ask the University Grants Commission to take steps against Vigarunnisa University authorities if it does not return the land and funds to the school.

The managing committee and teachers of VNSC earlier alleged that its former principal Hamida Ali in connivance with the former chair-

man of the managing committee Dr HBM lgbal transferred land and

funds of VNSC to Vigarunnisa University, a private university which is separate from the school. They alleged that Hamida Ali transferred a 10-bigha plot of VNSC land to Dr H B M Igbal, President of

Vigarunnisa University Foundation. through two separate deeds. They also alleged that Tk six core of VNSC was transferred from the Sonali Bank branch on the school premises to Premier Bank, a large equity share of which is owned by Dr HBM lgbal.

"In the film sequences since 1998 only the doubles appear," said Dieter Buhmann, a Homburg coroner. "He himself has not been seen again."
