SSC exams results under BOU announced

Certificate (SSC) 1st and 2nd year final examination of 2001 under the Bangladesh Open University (BOU) have been announced.

A total of 18,000 students appeared in these examinations, held in March this year, of which 7,283 came out successful. Pass percentage is 40.46 per cent.

Of the successful examinees, 211 obtained grade A, 4,539 grade B, 2,495 grade C and only 39 got D Grade.
