Moreover, it will reinforce inter-regional cooperation through such forums as ASEM and APEC. Korea will continue to participate in the UN peacekeeping operations in East Timor; contribute to international efforts to address refugee women and children. Korea will join the four anti-terrorism conventions and actively participate in anti-Korea is strongly committed to terror efforts of the international bodies such as the UN and the ARF.

General high schools teaching humanities totaled 1,210 as of 2001, with an enrollment of 2.25 million (2,259,975). Vocational high schools numbering 759 were teaching 651,198 students. In the same year, 99.5 per cent of middle school graduates advanced to high schools.

Higher education


There are five categories of institutions of higher learning: (1) junior colleges (2-3 years), (2) colleges and universities with four year undergraduate programs (six-year mediissues and promote the rights of | cal schools), (3) universities of education or normal schools, (4) theological colleges and seminaries and (5) graduate schools.

About 80 percent of these institutions are private. Whether public or

private, they come under the supervision of the Ministry of Education and Human Resources Development. The Ministry has control over such matters as the number of students each institution can accommodate, teacher qualifications, curricula and degree requirements.

The curricula are composed of general and professional courses and each is again divided into required and elective courses. In 1945 there were only 19 institutions of higher learning across the nation, including North Korea. By 2001, 1261 institutions were registered in South Korea alone. A total of 3,500,560 students were enrolled at these institutions, staffed by 58,532 faculty members.


