Japanese lawmaker stabbed to death

A Japanese opposition lawmaker known for his aggressive probing into ruling party scandals was stabbed to death yesterday in what could be Japan's first political assassination in more than four decades.

Police said Democratic Party politician Koki Ishii, 61, was attacked in front of his home in central Tokyo by an unidentified man in his 50s who ran away.

With the perpetrator still on the run, the motive for the crime was unclear. Japanese lawmakers have been attacked in the past, sometimes by right-wing extremists with gangster links.

But it was a rare case of deadly violence against a politician in a land that saw its last political assassination of a lawmaker in 1960, when a Socialist leader was killed by a rightwing youth.

Media reports said Ishii had been about to step into his car when a man wearing a red bandanna approached and stabbed him. apparently with a sashimi knife without saying anything.

The man had been seen outside Ishii's home in the upmarket Setagaya neighbourhood for about two hours before the killing, the reports said.

Rebels kill 21 civilians in Algeria

#### **REUTERS**, Algiers

Suspected Islamic rebels killed 21 civilians, including a three-monthold baby, overnight in western Algeria, the official Algerian news agency APS said yesterday.

The massacre took place at Ouled Abdallah village in Chlef province, some 170 km (100 miles) west of Algiers, APS said, quoting security officials.

Five people also had serious head injuries.

The victims were between three months and 65 years of age. Government security forces have launched a man-hunt for the perpetrators of the attacks, the agency said.

Seven civilians were killed in a similar rebel raid on Sunday in Skikda province, about 340 km (210 miles) east of the capital Algiers.

The latest deaths raised the number of Algerians killed in rebel attacks and police and military operations in the past nine months to more than 1,000.

Algeria has been racked by violence since early 1992, when army-backed authorities cancelled the second round of parliamentary polls that radical Islamists were poised to win.

More than 100,000 people have been killed since then, the government says. Independent sources estimate the death toll at up to 150.000

AL leader and Deputy Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Abdul Hamid Advocate said, "This is something unprecedented... A law can't be like this where the government decides which cases to be referred to special tribunals and which not.

Cases in connection with these criminal offences can be automatically referred to special tribunals for speedy trial and there should not be any discretionary power in government's hand

"I am afraid, in this process, cases in which opposition activists are accused would be referred to special tribunals and cases in which BNP men are accused would be exempted," said Hamid.

AL leader and former law minister Abdul Matin Khasru termed it a 'black law, which is unconstitutiona and untenable also.

"As per the Constitution, laws should be uniform. But this one is arbitrary ... as some persons accused for the same type of offences would enjoy more time for self-defence in normal courts while others would go through a speedy

trial process," he explained. Khasru said a special session of parliament could be convened to discuss appropriate measures to

curb crimes He also criticised the provision of taking telephonic conversation as evidence. This also violates constitutional provisions which guarantee

Though the city is surrounded by a network of rivers and some beautiful lakes and natural water bodies here and there, boating as a form of recreation has not developed much among the residents of Dhaka. Their interest mainly centres around the boat races that are held periodically on the river Buriganga on important national occasions like Independence Day, Victory Day, etc. But, besides these boat races. no organised effort is visible to popularise boating as a form of recreational sport. It is however felt by many involved in the sport in one way or another in other countries of both the East and the West that there are immense possibilities to develop boating in Dhaka City as a recreational sport for the citydwellers

In this context, some choice spots in the city may be suggested where boating could be introduced as a healthy and pleasurable outdoor activity without much financial involvement but only the necessary organisational effort. One such area is the Dhanmondi Lake, which at present is undergoing a process of renovation and development under an ambitious project. When that project is completed, there will be provision for introducing boating as a regular feature of recreational activities in the lake

After hearing both the sides, Magistrate Maksudur Rahman Patwarv fixed October 28 for hearing the bail petition and ordered sending him to Dhaka Central Jail. He also directed the jail authorities to take necessary steps for the lawmaker's treatment.

The magistrate also asked the authorities concerned to send to the additional district magistrate, Dhaka, a copy of the petition for his (Selim) division in iail

Later, the AL leader was produced before the court of first class magistrate Saifullah Panna, where he was shown arrested for his involvement in

the attack on Khaleda's motorcade. The ASP of CID, Mohammad Aminul Islam, submitted a petition before the court seeking a seven-day remand for Selim.
